THE OPENING DRIVE

The rivalry known as "The Backyard Brawl" between Twinsburg and Nordonia will be renewed Oct. 21 at Boliantz Stadium. The teams come into the game off very different Week 8 emotions.

The Tigers went on the road and earned a huge victory over Hudson, 21-12. The Knights gave up 66 points at home in a loss to North Royalton.

Offense has been a strength for Nordonia (3-5) this season with sophomore QB Robby Levak, junior running back Tye Evans and senior running back Anthony Perrine leading the attack. Defensively, the Knights have struggled as they have allowed 44.2 points per game. Nordonia has not allowed less than 20 points in a game this season.

Twinsburg has had a pair of three-game losing streaks this year stopped by victories – the first was a one-point win over North Royalton and the most recent was the signature win over Hudson.

The Tigers are lead offensively by an array of talented playmakers. Quarterbacks Jalen Tucker and Adam Van de Motter pace the attack with Jared Eaton and Cam'Ron McClain running the ball, and wideout Tre Radford as the main option in the passing attack.

Defensively, Twinsburg stepped up to hold Hudson to 12 points – a season best for the Tigers. James Grammens, Isaiah Savitt and Timmy Edwards are among a host of players making a big impact on defense for Coach Mike Bell.

Nordonia is currently in 13th in Division II, Region 5 and would need to win out and get some help to qualify for the postseason. Twinsburg would like nothing more than to prevent that from happening in this neighborhood rivalry.

TIGERS RECAP

Signature Win for Tigers

Twinsburg TIGERS **21**

Hudson Explorers **12**

Week 8, October 14, 2016, Memorial Stadium

Twinsburg earned the signature victory Coach Mike Bell was confident his team had the potential to get when the Tigers went on the road and defeated Hudson, 21-12, on Oct. 14.

Cam'Ron McClain rushed for an 8-yard TD and Jared Eaton scored on an 11-yard run in the first quarter as Twinsburg (2-6) took a 14-0 lead into the locker room at halftime.

A Colt Pallay TD pass to Greg Mailey cut the deficit in half for the Explorers, but the Tigers responded with a 35-yard touchdown strike from Jalen Tucker to Tre Radford to jump back on top, 21-7.

Hudson (6-2) kicked a field goal and recorded a safety in the fourth quarter, but Twinsburg held on for the biggest win in Bell's two years at the helm of the Tigers.

"Our players finally put together a complete game," Bell said. "Our young men remained focused, executed at a high level and played for 48 minutes and all three phases of the game complemented each other. These things, collectively, are a recipe for success and as a result we were able to outplay and beat a very good football team."

Tucker finished with 143 yards passing a touchdown. Twinsburg was efficient on third downs, converting 7 of 17 attempts to help keep the Hudson offense off the field. The Tigers also were successful on 2 of 4 fourth downs.

Twinsburg also won the turnover battle convincingly as Hudson had four turnovers and the Tigers did not have any.

COACH BELL REACHES MILESTONE WIN

Bell won his 100th career game with a 28-27 victory over North Royalton on Sept. 16.

Bell's first win came in 2002 at Lake Catholic.

"To be honest, it is kind of a big relief to have finally gotten that 100th win out of the way," Bell said. "It seems as though it's been a monkey on the back for a while. I can tell you this, I did not do it alone. Every player and coach that I have had the opportunity to work with is responsible for this achievement. It has caused me to do a little reflecting and reminiscing and to realize just how blessed I am to do what I do."

Knights - State Runnerup

The Knights are just two seasons removed from a Division II playoff run that saw Nordonia cruise in the state championship game against the Cincinnati LaSalle Lancers.

Although the Knights came up short in quest of the school's first football championship, Nordonia was impressive in their four playoff games leading in the title game.

The Knights scored 50 or more points in all four of the playoff games leading up to the LaSalle showdown, averaging almost 55 points per game in wins over Fremont Ross, Perrysburg, Midview (in the Regional Championship game) and Mayfield (in the State Semifinal game).

The Knights scored 667 points in their 15 games during the 2014 season. The 667 points is the 13th most points scored in a single season in the OHSAA's history.

Locally, only Kirtland has scored more in a single season.

Boliantz Stadium Repairs

A retaining wall at Nordonia High School's William Boliantz Stadium was discovered to be cracked during a summer inspection. The wall required immediate repair, less than six years after the stadium's first game.

The retaining wall on the home side of the stadium bleachers was cracked and was replaced this summer.

The cost was under \$200,000, but the district was unable to determine if the wall was designed wrong or built wrong.

HEAD COACH MIKE BELL

Hired February 4, 2015

Mike Bell is in his second year as coach of the Tigers and is looking to build on his past successes, bringing winning football back to Twinsburg.

Prior to coming to Twinsburg, Bell served one year as the head coach at Eastlake North and had a very successful 12-year run as head coach at Lake Catholic in Mentor.

In 12 seasons at Lake Catholic, the Cougars won 6 NCL Championships, qualified for the state playoffs 8 times (playoff record of 17-8) with 5 Regional Title appearances (2003, 2006, 2007, 2009, 2010) and 3 state semifinal appearances (2007, 2009, and 2010).

Prior to 2002, Bell served as the Cougars' defensive coordinator for three seasons, winning the Division III State Championship in 2001.

Prior to coaching at Lake Catholic, Bell spent three years at Willoughby South as a position coach and defensive coordinator, four years at Maple Heights, and two seasons at his alma mater Pymatuning Valley.

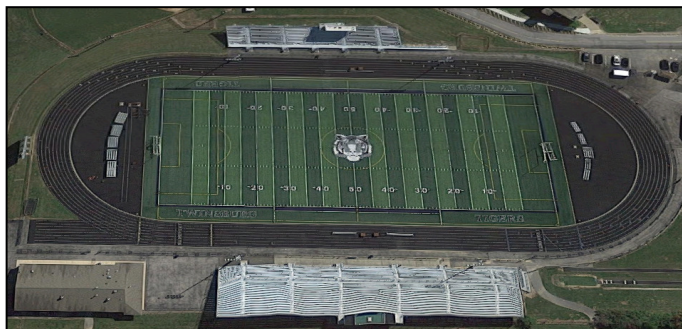

Twinsburg Tiger Stadium is one of the most used athletic facilities in Northeast Ohio. Twinsburg officials say Tiger Stadium's field gets used upwards of 950 times each year for various athletic events and practices -- from football, to soccer, to Relay For Life, to regional sporting events.

In the summer of 2015, the Stadium received a major upgrade to the playing surface. New field turf was installed featuring a unique blue border and a large Tiger logo at midfield. The 'grass' has a "paneled" look of lighter and darker green shades every five yards replacing a the carpet that was installed in 2005.

Tiger Stadium has become a perennial site for OHSAA football playoff games, hosting two games last year including the Region 23 championship game.

1ST AND TEN WITH JIM LIPINSKI

Lipinski is the Running Backs Coach for the Tigers

1 – What led you to be a high school football coach and what is the most rewarding part of your position with the Tigers?

From a very young age athletics was a huge part of my life, I participated in 4 varsity sports in high school and continued my career as a baseball player at Youngstown State University. The education career allows me to work with student athletes to make them better football players but more importantly, better men moving forward.

4 – A lot of pageantry and behind the scenes emotions are part of high school football in Northeast Ohio – as a coach, what is your favorite part of Friday night game day? Pregame, in the locker room, halftime, postgame, etc?

My favorite part of High school football is watching our young men compete and have success. There is something about Friday Night lights in Ohio that brings back great memories from both the sidelines as a coach and in between the lines as a player.

THIS DATE IN SPORTS HISTORY

October 21, 1973 - Fred Dryer, a defensive end for the Los Angeles Rams became the first player in NFL history to score two safeties in the same game. The Rams defeated the Green Bay Packers at the LA Coliseum, 24-7.

October 21, 1975 - In the 12th inning of Game 6 of the 1975 World Series at Fenway Park, Red Sox catcher Carlton Fisk hit a pitch off of Cincinnati Reds pitcher Pat Darcy that went down the left field line and appeared to be heading into foul territory. The image of Fisk jumping and waving the ball fair as he made his way to first base is considered by many to be one of baseball's greatest moments. The ball struck the foul pole, giving the Red Sox a 7-6 win and forcing a seventh and deciding game of the Fall Classic.

October 21, 2007 - The Cleveland Indians lose Game 7 of the American League Championship Series to the Boston Red Sox. The Indians led the series 3 games to 1, but were outscored by the Red Sox 30-5 over the final three games of the series, including an 11-2 defeat in Game 7. The Red Sox went on to sweep the Colorado Rockies in the World Series and win the franchise's second title in 4 seasons. Current Indians manager Terry Francona was the skipper of the Red Sox in 2007.
