THE OPENING DRIVE

Twinsburg will try to erase the sting of a close loss to Solon in Week 2, but it won't be easy as the Tigers travel to Aurora to face a Greenmen team still seeking their first win of the season.

Akron commit and senior athlete Gavin Blunt is one of several Aurora starters returning and looking for another postseason opportunity. The Greenmen move down from Division II and III relying on their defense led by a pair of senior linebackers in Cole Miller and Brent Henderson.

In a Week 2 loss to Euclid, senior quarterback Evan Fromwiller led Aurora with 142 total yards and two touchdowns, one passing and one rushing.

Junior Jack Arnold added 57 yards on 14 carries.

Twinsburg is led offensively by quarterbacks Adam Van de Motter and Seth Grabowski. Tre Radford and Christian Edgeron are dangerous wideouts for the Tigers.

Cam'Ron McClain provides good balance in the running game.

Defensively, linebackers James Grammens and Isaiah Savitt are playmakers that are constantly around the football. With both teams eyeing the postseason, the winner here will earn valuable computer points.

Tigers Give Comets All They Can Handle in Week 2

Twinsburg has come a long way from the beginning of 2016, but not quite far enough to defeat Division I power Solon on Sept. 1.

A year after losing to the Comets by six touchdowns, the Tigers gave Solon all it could handle before falling, 26-21.

The Comets (2-0) opened the scoring on a TD pass from J.T. Caver to Casey Maniglia.

Twinsburg tied the score at 7 in the third quarter on a 1-yard touchdown run from Isaiah Savitt and a PAT by Brandon Callow.

A pair of touchdown runs by Solon's Thomas Wilks put the Comets on top, 20-7, heading into the fourth quarter.

Savitt's second score of the night, on a pass from Adam Van de Motter, pulled the Tigers to within six at 20-14 before the Comets pushed the lead out to 26-14 on another Caver to Maniglia hookup.

Christian Edgerson pulled in a 48-yard TD pass from Van de Motter to close the scoring for Twinsburg (1-1).

Van de Motter finished 10 of 19 for 204 yards and 2 TDs.

Cam'Ron McClain had 89 yards on the ground for the Tigers.

Tre Radford caught six passes for 109 yards in the loss.

AURORA NEWS AND NOTES

ANNUAL PLAYOFF CONTENDER

The Aurora Greenmen, under head coach Bob Mihalik, have become annual participants in the OHSAA playoffs.

The Greenmen have made the playoffs every year since 2005, an 12-year run.

Aurora won its lone state championship in 2008, defeating Columbus Eastmoor Academy 21-10 on November 8.

The Greenmen have reached the state semifinals three times in that 12-year span, including back-to-back appearances in 2011 and 2012.

The Greenmen made the playoffs last year as a 9-1 team in Division II, Region 5, holding in the #1 seed in the region. But a loss in the regional semifinal to long-time rival Hudson, stopped a run at a second state championship.

In the 2017 Aurora football team might not be the exact duplicate of the physical, punishing, ground-dominating squad that has become a force in recent years.

This year's version of the Greenmen has something it hasn't had in previous years.

That would be speed ... and lots of it.

DID YOU KNOW

Aurora has won 29 conference championships in its history and eight of those titles have come in the last 10 titles.

The Greenmen won four straight conference titles in the 2000s as well as in the 1990s. The team also won three consecutive conference championships in the 1920s and 1930s.

HEAD COACH MIKE BELL

Hired February 4, 2015

Mike Bell is in his third year as coach of the Tigers and is looking to build on his past successes, bringing winning football back to Twinsburg.

Prior to coming to Twinsburg, Bell served one year as the head coach at Eastlake North and had a very successful 12-year run as head coach at Lake Catholic in Mentor.

In 12 seasons at Lake Catholic, the Cougars won 6 NCL Championships, qualified for the state playoffs 8 times (playoff record of 17-8) with 5 Regional Title appearances (2003, 2006, 2007, 2009, 2010) and 3 state semifinal appearances (2007, 2009, and 2010).

Prior to 2002, Bell served as the Cougars' defensive coordinator for three seasons, winning the Division III State Championship in 2001.

Prior to coaching at Lake Catholic, Bell spent three years at Willoughby South as a position coach and defensive coordinator, four years at Maple Heights, and two seasons at his alma mater Pymatuning Valley.

GRIDIRON CLUB

Twinsburg coach Mike Bell has always been a strong believer in building a program and not just simply a football team that competes on Friday night.

Part of that is the involvement of those outside of the players and coaches, including the administration, the community and perhaps most importantly, the football parents.

Bell said the Tigers are extremely lucky to have the support of The Gridiron Club at Twinsburg and he doesn't take it for granted.

"It starts with our administration doing a great job getting our young men the equipment and necessities for the game, but when you think about all the extras to make us a first-class program that is where the Gridiron Club comes in and really help us," Bell said.

"There are a million ways for parents to get involved and I always encourage parents to get involved and do what they can because it doesn't last forever at the high school level obviously. The years go fast."

The Gridiron Club is an organization of football parents in grades 7 through 12. There is no fee to join and all members of the community are welcome to attend meetings. The Club meets the second Monday of the month at Twinsburg High School. Meetings begin at 6:00 p.m. All of the fundraising is run through Twinsburg Athletic Boosters.

The Gridiron Club raises funds to help support the team off the turf. From purchasing a new sound system for the locker room to feeding the boys on Friday nights and scrimmages, purchasing football gear such as t-shirts and cinch bags, senior gifts and hosting the end of year banquet. These events are important in developing a sense of unity and pride in the program.

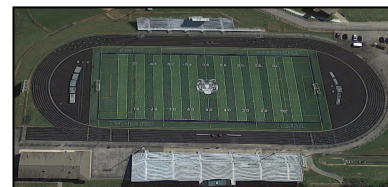

Twinsburg Tiger Stadium is one of the most used athletic facilities in Northeast Ohio. Twinsburg officials say Tiger Stadium's field gets used upwards of 950 times each year for various athletic events and practices -- from football, to soccer, to Relay For Life, to regional sporting events.

In the summer of 2015, the Stadium received a major upgrade to the playing surface. New field turf was installed featuring a unique blue border and a large Tiger logo at midfield. The 'grass' has a "paneled" look of lighter and darker green shades every five yards replacing a carpet that was installed in 2005.

Tiger Stadium has become a perennial site for OHSAA football playoff games, hosting two games last year - the Division I Region 1 Semifinal (St Edward vs Stow) and the Division II Region 5 Final (Hudson and Warren Harding)

1ST AND TEN WITH TOM CONIGLIO

Coniglio serves in an administrative and developmental role for the youth football and the middle school

1 - How did you first get involved in the NTYF (Nordia / Twinsburg Youth Football)?

A - I spent nine years coaching at CWRU. I played there for Jim Chapman and then was on his staff and ultimately on Ron Stuckey's staff who took over for Jim (both Willoughby South guys). After leaving Case, we ultimately moved to Twinsburg and after being out of coaching, was on Al Hodakievic's staff for three years until my son started playing organized sports and decided to focus my attention to him. That is where my involvement in NTYF started in 2013 and really getting involved in youth sports.

2 - What do you feel is the most important aspect of athlete development at the youth level and then at the middle school level?

A - Without question, the most important aspect of the development of youth athletes is the coaching they get during their first experience in that sport. While many adults are coaching youth sports to be involved with their child, it is important that our youth coaches have a fundamental knowledge of the sport, are able to teach those fundamentals, and prepare that child for continued growth the next year, whether it be at the same level or if the child is moving up to the "next level". That has been my premise, while making it fun so they want to continue to play and instilling the intangibles like discipline and team values. Youth football in my opinion is really the first time a kid has an opportunity to understand his actions impact the team and all of them have to work together for the common good...teamwork! As far as Middle School, I never believed that the structure of NTYF (Nordia/ Twinsburg Youth Football), enabled us to connect the dots between the youth program and the school program. As the VP of NTYF, I worked with the president, a Nordonia resident, to begin separating NTYF to Twinsburg Youth Football and Nordonia Youth Football, which will become completely separate next year. This has enabled us to work more closely with the high school programs.

3 - As a vested member of the community, do you take any extra sense of responsibility or pride in trying to help Twinsburg develop into a premier football program?

A - I feel a STRONG sense of responsibility in helping keep these kids here and help our program be a premier football program. Since my time on Al's staff and through my years with the youth program, I have always felt Twinsburg could be just that with the kids we have here. The 7th and 8th grade group currently is an example of that! We have kids in that group that could contribute to achieving that goal if we keep them here.

4 - How has Coach Bell and staff been to work with since arriving at Twinsburg as far as his involvement in the youth program and the middle school teams?

A - Coach Bell and his staff are great coaches and good people, first and foremost. I remember reading an article of an interview that was done with Coach Bell after he took the job here and in the article he mentioned his philosophy on the importance of a youth football program. I immediately reached out to him when I was with NTYF and he was all in...telling me whatever I needed, just ask and he would work with me to make it happen, from his youth camps to NTYF NIGHT at a Twinsburg Varsity game. Last year, he would routinely visit our practices after his and even made time on a Sunday to come and watch one of our youth football playoff games with his wife. As a member of his staff this year, he has made sure our Middle School program has whatever we need from equipment, locker rooms, practice time and he has given me full access to his library of information to make sure these kids are learning his system and his philosophy of how to be Twinsburg Tigers. His staff has given me their time individually and collectively to help in any way they can to make sure we are connecting the dots between the Middle School and the Varsity program. I have the utmost respect for Coach Bell and each member of his staff and I am confident they will achieve the goals he has set for the program. As a resident, parent and now part of the staff, I have seen his priorities in the youth program and the Middle School start a solid foundation for years to come. When I sat down with Coach Bell last year after the season and we were meeting about possibly joining his staff, I was going through my coaching resume and talking about the youth program, I asked him out of the blue, so why did you pick Twinsburg for your next job? His response, without hesitation was..."I thought we could win a state championship here". At that point, I was all in!

THIS DATE IN HISTORY

September 8, 1995 - The Cleveland Indians defeated the Baltimore Orioles 3-2 at Jacobs Field to clinch the American League Central Division Championship and qualify for baseball's postseason for the first time since 1954.

When third baseman Jim Thome squeezed the final out on a foul pop by Jeff Huson, the Indians celebrated their first division title in 41 years. Eddie Murray singled home Kenny Lofton and Carlos Baerga in the bottom of the third inning to give the Indians a 3-1 lead and Jose Mesa's 40th save finished off a strong start by Orel Hershiser.

The Indians finished the day 23.5 games ahead of Kansas City with 21 games to play. The 1995 Indians went 100-44 in a season shortened at the beginning by a strike. The Indians would go on to defeat the Red Sox in the Division Series, the Seattle Mariners in the League Championship Series and eventually fall to the Atlanta Braves in six games in the World Series.
