THE OPENING DRIVE

Twinsburg will be looking to snap a two-game losing streak with a trip to Stow on Oct. 6.

This starts a brutal stretch of league games for the Tigers where the next three teams they face in the Suburban League have a combined 16-2 record.

The Bulldogs are off to a 5-1 start after winning a share of the conference title with Hudson last season, but did lose several starters. Head coach Mark Nori is back for his eighth season looking to earn the program's third straight playoff berth. Junior defensive lineman and fullback Adrian Woliver is a key piece on defense. On offense, Coryon Rice has emerged as a leader and weapon at QB. Senior wide receiver Tyler Shaver and senior tailback Terrain Wray are two of several skilled position players.

Twinsburg played two games in six days and lost by to North Royalton and Brecksville-Broadview Heights in contests that were both very winnable heading into the fourth quarter.

The Tigers (3-3) continue to platoon quarterbacks Adam Van de Motter and Seth Grabowski and both have made big plays this season. Cam/Ron McClain continues to be a workhorse at running back while Christian Edgerson, Tre Radford and Isaiah Savitt are all capable playmakers in the pass game.

On defense, All-Ohio candidate James Grammens is as consistent a linebacker as there is in the Suburban League. Rashad Jones-Land and Savitt have stepped up on that side of the ball as well. James Bessett had a highlight reel, one-handed interception vs. BBH.

TIGERS RECAP

Last Second Drive Falls Short;

Tigers Drop Heartbreaker to Bees

Brecksville Bees **35**

Twinsburg TIGERS **27**

In a game that came down to the final snap, the Brecksville-Broadview Heights defense was able to prevent Twinsburg from scoring a game-tying touchdown with time expiring to secure a 35-27 win on the road.

Quickly driving down the field after Brecksville (4-2) turned it over on downs with 18 seconds left in the game, Twinsburg quarterback Seth Grabowski found fellow senior Christian Edgerson for a last-second 34-yard touchdown strike, but an offensive penalty wiped out the score.

The next play, the Bees were able to deflect a long pass and seal the victory.

Brecksville freshman quarterback Joe Labas and senior wide out Sam Wiglusz connected for three touchdowns. Labas finished the night with four touchdown tosses and an interception.

Edgerson had his way in the first quarter, hauling in multiple receptions and the first touchdown of the game on a 35-yard pass from Adam Van de Motter. Van de Motter also ran for a score in the second quarter to tie the game at 14 heading to halftime.

Just as Twinsburg (3-3) began to drive after falling down a touchdown late in the third quarter, Bees junior defensive lineman Tanner Watson caused a fumble to give his offense great field position. Brecksville went on to capitalize, as Labas and Wiglusz completed their third-quarter hat trick with another TD pass to take a 35-21 lead with 19 seconds left in the quarter.

Attempting to tie the game in the final quarter down by eight, Twinsburg went for it on fourth and five. Bees linebacker Michael Graham immediately knocked down Grabowski's attempt over the middle to allow his team to take over on downs on their own 29-yard line with 3:41 left to go in the game.

On the other side, Twinsburg's Isaiah Savitt had a big game. He tallied two touchdowns, one on a bubble screen from Grabowski in the third quarter and the other late in the fourth to keep Twinsburg alive with 7:21 left in the contest

Van de Motter finished with 229 yards passing for the Tigers.

HEAD COACH MIKE BELL

Hired February 4, 2015

Mike Bell is in his third year as coach of the Tigers and is looking to build on his past successes, bringing winning football back to Twinsburg.

Prior to coming to Twinsburg, Bell served one year as the head coach at Eastlake North and had a very successful 12-year run as head coach at Lake Catholic in Mentor.

In 12 seasons at Lake Catholic, the Cougars won 6 NCL Championships, qualified for the state playoffs 8 times (playoff record of 17-8) with 5 Regional Title appearances (2003, 2006, 2007, 2009, 2010) and 3 state semifinal appearances (2007, 2009, and 2010).

Prior to 2002, Bell served as the Cougars' defensive coordinator for three seasons, winning the Division III State Championship in 2001.

Prior to coaching at Lake Catholic, Bell spent three years at Willoughby South as a position coach and defensive coordinator, four years at Maple Heights, and two seasons at his alma mater Pymatuning Valley.

Twinsburg coach Mike Bell has always been a strong believer in building a program and not just simply a football team that competes on Friday night.

Part of that is the involvement of those outside of the players and coaches, including the administration, the community and perhaps most importantly, the football parents.

Bell said the Tigers are extremely lucky to have the support of The Gridiron Club at Twinsburg and he doesn't take it for granted.

"It starts with our administration doing a great job getting our young men the equipment and necessities for the game, but when you think about all the extras to make us a first-class program that is where the Gridiron Club comes in and really help us," Bell said.

"There are a million ways for parents to get involved and I always encourage parents to get involved and do what they can because it doesn't last forever at the high school level obviously. The years go fast."

The Gridiron Club is an organization of football parents in grades 7 through 12. There is no fee to join and all members of the community are welcome to attend meetings. The Club meets the second Monday of the month at Twinsburg High School. Meetings begin at 6:00 p.m. All of the fundraising is run through Twinsburg Athletic Boosters.

The Gridiron Club raises funds to help support the team off the turf. From purchasing a new sound system for the locker room to feeding the boys on Friday nights and scrimmages, purchasing football gear such as t-shirts and cinch bags, senior gifts and hosting the end of year banquet. These events are important in developing a sense of unity and pride in the program.

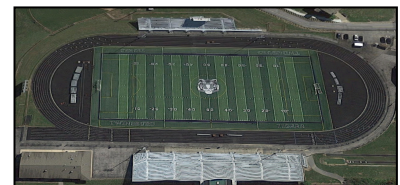

Twinsburg Tiger Stadium is one of the most used athletic facilities in Northeast Ohio. Twinsburg officials say Tiger Stadium's field gets used upwards of 950 times each year for various athletic events and practices -- from football, to soccer, to Relay For Life, to regional sporting events.

In the summer of 2015, the Stadium received a major upgrade to the playing surface. New field turf was installed featuring a unique blue border and a large Tiger logo at midfield. The 'grass' has a "paneled" look of lighter and darker green shades every five yards replacing a carpet that was installed in 2005.

Tiger Stadium has become a perennial site for OHSAA football playoff games, hosting two games last year - the Division I Region 1 Semifinal (St Edward vs Stow) and the Division II Region 5 Final (Hudson and Warren Harding)

1st AND 10 WITH MICHAEL SHERER

Sherer is an Athletic Trainer with Twinsburg High School

1 - What is your background and how did you come to be the athletic trainer at Twinsburg?

A - Background - 1977 Graduate of Baldwin-Wallace College, now Baldwin -Wallace University. BA of Health and Physical Education with emphasis on Athletic Training.

Back in 1989-90 Twinsburg requested game coverage and one day a week visitation for a injury clinic. I provided the weekly visitation for the injury clinic. The fall sport season of 1990 I was hired to work at Twinsburg High School as the athletic trainer through Ohio Physical Therapy and Sports Medicine. In 1998 I was hired full time as the athletic trainer and teacher in the HPE Department teaching a Sports Medicine Class.

2 - What is your primary focus on game day? Are you able to enjoy the game or are you ultimately just focused on the health and safety of the athletes?

A - Primary focus - Making sure everyone gets what they need before pre-game (taping, stretching, padding etc) and at game time focusing on the players to ensure their health and safety is ok. I am primarily watching the players more than the game as a whole.

3 - How closely do you work with the coaching staff when it comes to determining the extent of an injury and the ability of the athlete to return to action?

A - We have a strong communication between us and the coaching staff to ensure we are on the same page with the athlete on the return to play policy.

4 - Having served in your role for such a great length of time and taking care of so many athletes in so many sports over the years, do you have a sense of accomplishment or pride in the fact that your work is vital to keep the young men and women as healthy as possible so they go on to achieve success on and off the field of play beyond high school?

A - There is a strong sense of pride that goes with being here for a long time. I have seen athletes grow up and become very successful in the outside world. I teach a Sports Medicine class and through the years numerous athletes and students in my class have gone on to a job in the medical field.

Two former student-athletes are Doctors, four students have become certified athletic trainers, numerous students have become nurses and pharmacist. Other fields that students have enter are physical therapy, occupational therapy and one became a strength coach for a college team. It's a great feeling when you see former athletes on the sideline or attending a winter event and they come up and say "hi" and talk about their accomplishments.

THIS DATE IN HISTORY

October 6, 2010 - Philadelphia Phillies starting pitcher Roy Halladay pitches the second no-hitter in MLB Postseason History during Game 1 of the NLDS, as the Phillies defeat the Cincinnati Reds 4-0 at Citizens Bank Park.

October 6, 1991 - The Baltimore Orioles' played their final game at Memorial Stadium - a 7-1 loss to the Detroit Tigers. The following spring the O's would move to the first of the modern retro ballpark in the Major Leagues - Orioles Park at Camden Yards. Since then 24 of the other 29 teams in MLB have had new retro ballparks constructed or have seen major renovations to existing structures. The Atlanta Braves have moved into TWO new stadiums since Camden Yards opened 27 years ago.

October 6, 1983 - The NY Jets announce they are leaving Shea Stadium in Flushing Meadows (QQueens) for Giants Stadium in East Rutherford, NJ. The 1984 season will be the first in NFL history with no teams playing IN the city of New York.
