# THE OPENING DRIVE

GAME DAY 360

Twinsburg will look to snap a four-game losing streak when the Tigers host Hudson on Oct. 20.

Last year, Twinsburg traveled to Hudson and stunned the Explorers, 21-12. Hudson finished 8-2 and made the Division II postseason. This year, the Explorers are again in the mix for a D-II, Region 5 postseason berth and they are a game behind Wadsworth for the league lead after losing to Stow in Week 8.

Hudson (6-2, 4-1) is led by quarterback Colt Pallay, who accounted for three touchdowns in the loss to Stow. Greg Mailley, Dawson Wervey and Colin Palatini are solid weapons in the passing game for Pallay. Kevin Callahan is a steady running back for the Explorers.

Defensively, linebacker Anthony Rightnour leads a unit that has been very stingy in the six wins and has allowed 37 points per game in the two losses.

Twinsburg (3-5, 1-4) has been able to put points on the board all season, averaging 28.9 points per game. However, during the four-game losing streak against four very talented teams, the Tigers have allowed almost 40 points per game.

Offensively, quarterbacks Seth Grabowski and Adam Van der Motter continue to share reps. Running back Cam'Ron McClain is closing in on 1,000 yards for the season. Wideouts Tre Radford and Christian Edgerson are dangerous weapons in the passing game for Twinsburg.

Defensively, linebacker James Grammens continues his standout season for the Tigers. Isaiah Savitt, Rashad Land-Jones, Joe Bell and Khadafhi Taylor are among the impact players on defense for Twinsburg.

This is the first of back-to-back home games for the Tigers to close the regular season. Twinsburg will host Nordonia in Week 10.

**Tigers Suffer Third Consecutive Loss**

All-Ohio candidate Joey Baughman accounted for 400 total yards of offense and six touchdowns as unbeaten Wadsworth rolled to a 54-20 win over visiting Twinsburg on Oct. 13.

The Tigers are 3-5 overall and have now lost four straight games.

Twinsburg jumped out to an early 7-0 lead on a TD pass from Seth Grabowski to Tre Radford.

The Grizzlies (8-0) scored the next 34 points of the first half to take a commanding lead with Baughman leading the way with four TD passes.

Radford caught his second TD of the night in the third quarter from Adam Van der Motter and Christian Edgerson hauled in a touchdown grab from Grabowski in the fourth, but it was too much Baughman and the Wadsworth offense, which racked up 507 yards on the night.

Grabowski finished 8 of 13 for 136 yards and two TD passes. Cam'Ron McClain had 84 yards rushing for Twinsburg.

Edgerson hauled in five catches for 77 yards and a touchdown and Radford took both of his grabs to the end zone for the Tigers.

#### Hudson's Jeff Gough promoted to full-time head football coach

Hudson football coach Jeff Gough will be the permanent head coach for the Explorers going forward after the school promoted him from interim head coach

The school's board of education formally approved the promotion on Thursday.

"My mind had already been thinking about the offseason and what we need to do to improve as a program," Gough said. "At the same time, I was excited. I was really starting to think about what's next and how hard we have to work to improve and make the program better every day. As soon as they said it, I was like, 'Alright. Let's go. Let's do this thing.'

Gough, the Explorers' defensive coordinator prior to 2016, took over when former head coach Ron Wright announced in April he was stepping aside. Hudson went 11-3 last season and advanced to the Division II state semifinals, the school's third straight appearance in the state semifinals.

Wright had been the head coach of the Explorers from 2011-15, going 53-11 and leading the team to the first two state semifinal games in school history

### **HEAD COACH MIKE BELL**

HIRED FEBRUARY 4, 2015

**Mike Bell** is in his third year as coach of the Tigers and is looking to build on his past successes, bringing winning football back to Twinsburg.

Prior to coming to Twinsburg, Bell served one year as the head coach at Eastlake North and had a very successful 12-year run as head coach at Lake Catholic in Mentor.

In 12 seasons at Lake Catholic, the Cougars won 6 NCL Championships, qualified for the state playoffs 8 times (playoff record of 17-8) with 5 Regional Title appearances (2003, 2006,

2007, 2009, 2010) and 3 state semifinal appearances (2007, 2009, and 2010).

Prior to 2002, Bell served as the Cougars' defensive coordinator for three seasons, winning the Division III State Championship in 2001.

Prior to coaching at Lake Catholic, Bell spent three years at Willoughby South as a position coach and defensive coordinator, four years at Maple Heights, and two seasons at his alma mater Pymatuning Valley.

### **GRIDIRON CLUB**

Twinsburg coach Mike Bell has always been a strong believer in building a program and not just simply a football team that competes on Friday night.

Part of that is the involvement of those outside of the players and coaches, including the administration, the community and perhaps most importantly, the football parents. Bell said the Tigers are extremely lucky to have the support of The Gridiron Club at Twinsburg and he doesn't take it for granted.

"It starts with our administration doing a great job getting our young men the equipment and necessities for the game, but when you think about all the extras to make us a first-class program that is where the Gridiron Club comes in and really help us," Bell said.

"There are a million ways for parents to get involved and I always encourage parents to get involved and do what they can because it doesn't last forever at the high school level obviously. The years go fast."

The Gridiron Club is an organization of football parents in grades 7 through 12. There is no fee to join and all members of the community are welcome to attend meetings. The Club meets the second Monday of the month at Twinsburg High School. Meetings begin at 6:00 p.m. All of the fundraising is run through Twinsburg Athletic Boosters.

The Gridiron Club raises funds to help support the team off the turf. From purchasing a new sound system for the locker room to feeding the boys on Friday nights and scrimmages, purchasing football gear such as t-shirts and cinch bags, senior gifts and hosting the end of year banquet. These events are important in developing a sense of unity and pride in the program.

Twinsburg Tiger Stadium is one of the most used athletic facilities in Northeast Ohio. Twinsburg officials say Tiger Stadium's field gets used upwards of 950 times each year for various athletic events and practices – from football, to soccer, to Relay For Life, to regional sporting events.

In the summer of 2015, the Stadium received a major upgrade to the playing surface. New field turf was installed featuring a unique blue border and a large Tiger logo at midfield. The 'grass' has a "paneled" look of lighter and darker green shades every five yards replacing a the carpet that was installed in 2005.

Tiger Stadium has become a perennial site for OHSAA football playoff games, hosting two games last year - the Division I Region 1 Semifinal (St Edward vs Stow) and the Division II Region 5 Final (Hudson and Warren Harding)

# **1st AND 10 WITH MEGAN REISCH**

REISCH IS AN ATHLETIC TRAINER AT TWINSBURG HIGH SCHOOL

1 - What is your background and how did you end up as a student athletic trainer at Twinsburg?

A - I am a junior in the Athletic Training program at Kent State University. Junior year in the program the students move to off campus sites chosen by our clinical coordinator. Fortunately, she placed me at Twinsburg.

2 - What is a typical practice or game night experience like for you?

A - I really enjoy the athletic atmosphere. Whether its practice or a game I'm excited to be there for the athletes. I especially love game nights because I am able to see all my athletes hard work pay off. ### THIS DATE IN HISTORY

October 20, 1873 - Yale, Princeton, Columbia, and Rutgers universities draft the first code of American football rules.

On that date, representatives from the four universities met at the Fifth Avenue Hotel in New York City to codify the first set of intercollegiate football rules. Before this meeting, each school had its own set of rules and games were usually played using the home team's own particular code. At this meeting, a list of rules, based more on the Football Association's rules than the rules of the recently founded Rugby Football Union, was drawn up for intercollegiate football games.

However, these rules were based mostly on soccer. Harvard, which played a more rugby-heavy style, refused to attend the meeting, continuing to play the game their way, notably in two contests against McGill University (from Montreal). The two schools played essentially the same type of game, with rugby-style rules, including running with the ball. As Harvard slowly won over the other schools to its style of play, it necessitated a new meeting to standardize new rules. That meeting, known as the Massasoit Convention, created rules based largely on the Rugby Football Union code. The game was inching closer to what we know today as football.
