THE OPENING DRIVE

Copley visits Twinsburg in a rematch of a Week 1 game in 2017 won by the Tigers.

The Indians are coming off a 4-6 record under Coach Scott Chouniard. Sophomore QB Joe Reho will lead the offense. Devin Prude, Maliq Spragling, Tyson Durant and Corey Collins are among the top skill players. A solid offensive line is led by Tyler Lenke.

Matthew Lipford, Devon Frase and Zach Brown will be key impact players on defense for Copley. Punter Porter Wilson is a Duke recruit and a weapon on special teams.

Twinsburg is coming off a somewhat frustrating up-and-down 2017 season in which the Tigers started 3-1, lost five straight, then ended with a blowout win over Nordonia. Coach Mike Bell and company finished at 4-6 and are looking to bounce back and start 2018.

It will be difficult to replace standout running back Cam'Ron McClain, who led the team in rushing, Christian Edgerson, who led the team in receiving and James Grammens, who was the leading tackler. Isaiah Savitt will be missed on both sides of the ball.

Senior quarterback Adam Van de Motter takes over as the full-time QB after sharing duties previously. Tre Radford is one of the most dangerous wideouts in the area. Junior transfer Jamir James is a talented two-way player who should help Twinsburg immediately. The offensive line is big and physical and the unit as a whole is as deep as Bell had had in four seasons.

"I think one of the big things about this group that I have to point out is the senior leadership. It is as good as it has been since I have been here. And I really think they believe if we play our best football we are a playoff team this season. If we don't play our best it will be a different story when you look at the schedule and the league."

"I think we have a lot of talent and some really good skill guys on offense. And it is probably the best offensive line I've had since I've been here. Our quarterback is ready to take the ship after sharing duties in the past, so we have reason for excitement there. We lost more on defense, but we are confident in the guys over there especially up front."

Up-and-down 2017, New 2018 Focus Has the Tigers Thinking Postseason

INDIANS NEWS & NOTES

ORIGINAL MEMBER OF THE SUBURBAN LEAGUE

Currently, the Suburban League has 15 members, with seven teams in the American Division.

The Copley Indians are the longest consecutive member of the league, being one of three founding members currently in the conference. 2018 is the 70th season of Copley as a member of the Suburban League.

Copley joined the Suburban League in 1949, one of six teams forming a new league when teams departed the Summit County League.

Current Suburban League - National Division members Nordonia and Hudson were also members of the original six schools to form the Suburban League in the post-World War II era.

INDIANS ALUM - DELONE CARTER

Since 1987, The Associated Press has given out the annual Mr. Football Award in the state of Ohio.

Following the 2005 season, Copley running back, Delone Carter was named Ohio's Mr. Football.

After graduating from Copley, Carter attended the University of Syracuse, where he rushed for over 3,000 yards and 28 touchdowns in his career.

This included a 198-yard performance in the inaugural PinStripe Bowl played at Yankee Stadium on December 30, 2010.

Carter was selected by the Indianapolis Colts in the 4th round (119th overall pick) of the 2011 NFL Draft.

Two years later, Carter was traded by the Colts to the Baltimore Ravens and ended his career with the Jacksonville Jaguars in 2014.

For his NFL career, Carter gained just under 500 yards and scored five touchdowns.

HEAD COACH MIKE BELL

Hired February 4, 2015

Mike Bell is in his fourth year as coach of the Tigers and is looking to build on his past successes, bringing winning football back to Twinsburg.

Prior to coming to Twinsburg, Bell served one year as the head coach at Eastlake North and had a very successful 12-year run as head coach at Lake Catholic in Mentor.

In 12 seasons at Lake Catholic, the Cougars won 6 NCL Championships, qualified for the state playoffs 8 times (playoff record of 17-8) with 5 Regional Title appearances (2003, 2006, 2007, 2009, 2010) and 3 state semifinal appearances (2007, 2009, and 2010).

Prior to 2002, Bell served as the Cougars' defensive coordinator for three seasons, winning the Division III State Championship in 2001.

Prior to coaching at Lake Catholic, Bell spent three years at Willoughby South as a position coach and defensive coordinator, four years at Maple Heights, and two seasons at his alma mater Pymatuning Valley.

GRIDIRON CLUB

Twinsburg coach Mike Bell has always been a strong believer in building a program and not just simply a football team that competes on Friday night.

Part of that is the involvement of those outside of the players and coaches, including the administration, the community and perhaps most importantly, the football parents.

Bell said the Tigers are extremely lucky to have the support of The Gridiron Club at Twinsburg and he doesn't take it for granted.

"It starts with our administration doing a great job getting our young men the equipment and necessities for the game, but when you think about all the extras to make us a first-class program that is where the Gridiron Club comes in and really help us," Bell said.

"There are a million ways for parents to get involved and I always encourage parents to get involved and do what they can because it doesn't last forever at the high school level obviously. The years go fast."

The Gridiron Club is an organization of football parents in grades 7 through 12. There is no fee to join and all members of the community are welcome to attend meetings. The Club meets the second Monday of the month at Twinsburg High School. Meetings begin at 6:00 p.m. All of the fundraising is run through Twinsburg Athletic Boosters.

The Gridiron Club raises funds to help support the team off the turf. From purchasing a new sound system for the locker room to feeding the boys on Friday nights and scrimmages, purchasing football gear such as t-shirts and cinch bags, senior gifts and hosting the end of year

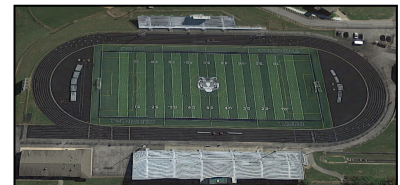

Twinsburg Tiger Stadium is one of the most used athletic facilities in Northeast Ohio. Twinsburg officials say Tiger Stadium's field gets used upwards of 950 times each year for various athletic events and practices -- from football, to soccer, to Relay For Life, to regional sporting events.

In the summer of 2015, the Stadium received a major upgrade to the playing surface. New field turf was installed featuring a unique blue border and a large Tiger logo at midfield. The 'grass' has a "paneled" look of lighter and darker green shades every five yards replacing a the carpet that was installed in 2005.

Tiger Stadium has become a perennial site for OHSAA football playoff games, hosting two games last year - the Division I Region 1 Semifinal (St Edward vs Stow) and the Division II Region 5 Final (Hudson and Warren Harding)

1st AND 10 WITH CHRIS KNOPIK

KNOPIK IS THE NEW OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR FOR THE TIGERS

1 - What is your football background and how did you get into coaching?

I grew up in a football family (my father was a head coach at Rootstown). I played offensive and defensive line at Southeast High School and played offensive line at Baldwin Wallace University. I switched my major to education in college because I could not envision myself without football. I've had so many fantastic coaches that have impacted my life, the opportunity to do that for others was too powerful of a calling to pass up. While I was finishing my student teaching, a former coach of mine (Beau Balderson) offered me the offensive and defensive line job at Parma Senior High School, and I have coached every season since.

2 - What was it about Coach Bell and the Twinsburg program that interested you in joining the staff?

When I first met Coach Bell this offseason, what stood out to me was his distinct vision and drive to build this program into something special. His passion and philosophy for developing young men into leaders coincided with what I feel is the most important part of coaching.

3 - What is your offensive philosophy and what type of offense should Twinsburg fans expect to see?

Offensively I believe in tailoring what you do to the strengths of your athletes, to put them into the best position to succeed. We will utilize a spread attack to force defenses to defend the entire field, both vertically and sideline to sideline. Fans should expect to see a read-based running attack, an air attack designed to pressure defenses into mismatches, and some creative formations to create advantages for our athletes.

4 - What is your favorite part of the Friday night game day experience?

My favorite part of Friday nights is seeing these young men, who have put in countless hours, reap the reward of their sacrifice. Riding with them through all the highs and lows this game throws you, and the life lessons taught along the way, is truly what makes this game special.

THIS DATE IN HISTORY

August 24, 2008 - The 16 days of the 2008 Summer Olympics in Beijing becomes the most watched event on TV ever - nearly 5 billion, 70% of world's population, watched some portion of the broadcasts.

August 24, 2006 - After signing a one-day contract with the San Francisco 49ers, Jerry Rice officially retires from the NFL. At his retirement, Rice, a first-round draft pick out of tiny Mississippi Valley State in 1985, leaves the field with 38 NFL records, including the most career receptions (1,549), yards receiving (22,895) and touchdowns receiving (197).

August 24, 1992 - The Cleveland Browns suffer their worst preseason loss in franchise history, 56-3, to the Minnesota Vikings at the Stadium. The Vikings dominated from the start, stopping Cleveland's first series on a fourth-down play near midfield, then scoring on Rich Gannon's 47-yard pass to Anthony Carter on their first offensive play. Gannon wrapped up a 35-point first half by hitting Carter with a 52-yard Hail Mary pass, tipped into the end zone by teammate Cris Carter. Carl Lee returned an interception of a Bernie Kosar pass 58 yards for a score.
