## THE OPENING DRIVE

Twinsburg will try to close the home portion of the schedule out with a win over the top team in its league as Wadsworth travels to Tiger Stadium on Oct. 12.

The Grizzlies are 7-0 and have only played one game decided by less than 10 points. Dominic Loparo is coming off a 3-touchdown performance in a win over North Royalton. Brock Snowball and Mitchell Evans also ran for scores as Wadsworth has moved to a more balanced offensive set as opposed to a 5-wide attack. Defensively, Mason McMillian and Jake Herbert are consistent playmakers for Wadsworth.

The Tigers had a 3-game winning streak snapped in Week 7 vs. Stow. Twinsburg is led by a balanced offensive attack. QB Adam Van de Motter has had several solid games running the offense and moving the ball in the air. Jamir James, Jameel Banks and James Besett are all dangerous offensive weapons.

Defensively, Twinsburg has been a bend-but-don't break unit, allowing some points, but making stops when needed. Rashad Jones-Land has been the most consistent producer on that side of the ball, but there are several playmakers.

The Tigers are currently 10th in Division II, Region 5. Twinsburg has road games at Hudson and Nordonia left to finish the regular season.

### BELL RINGING - Tigers Head Coach Mike Bell discusses last week's game against the Stow Bulldogs and the upcoming week 7 game vs Wadsworth

"Friday was a difficult loss for us. We had a few breakdowns in the second half that caused the game to get away from us. We got Stow's best effort of the season to date and did not respond well enough to win the game. The encouraging thing is that our young men continued to fight and battle to the end. We must learn all we can about ourselves in that loss and move forward to finish the season strong."

"Wadsworth is a well-coached and disciplined football team that rarely makes mistakes. They play an aggressive style of defense and will blitz a great deal of the time. Offensively they are a little different from a year ago. They are more of a 20 and 11 personnel team than the empty 5-wide team they were last season. They have shown the ability to run the ball effectively and efficiently with the return of senior Brock Snowball."

"Offensively we will need to focus on our protections and run schemes to handle their blitzing, and defensively we must continue to improve our tackling and overall pursuit to the ball. This should be an exciting week, especially for our seniors who are playing for the last time at Tiger Stadium."

## TIGERS REWIND

Stow scored the final 22 points in a 41-13 road win over Twinsburg, shutting out the Tigers in the second half on Oct. 5.

Twinsburg (4-3, 3-1 Suburban League National Division) entered as a Division II playoff contender, and are still alive, but will need a solid last three weeks.

Taking a 19-13 lead into halftime, Stow (2-5, 2-2) received a third-quarter spark from Bryce Sheppert.

After a safety made it 21-13, Sheppert took the ensuing kickoff 70 yards for a touchdown. Twinsburg could not make a dent in the two-touchdown deficit.

Quarterback Josh Andrassy then scored on a 29-yard run to inflate the Bulldogs' lead to 34-13.

Adrian Woliver finished off the Stow effort with a 59-yard interception-return TD.

Andrassy threw three first-half touchdown passes - a 10-yard connection with Sheppert, a 36-yarder to Dalen Stovall and a 12-yarder to Brian Cartwright - after Twinsburg scored the game's first TD.

The Tigers entered Week 7 ranked eighth in D-II, Region 5. They'll try to bounce back at home against National Division-leading Wadsworth on Oct. 12.

Stow has a road tilt against Hudson on tap in Week 8.

### Wadsworth Grizzlies Notes

#### MEDINA COUNTY RECEIVING RECORD

In a week 2 win (Aug. 31), Wadsworth WR Carson Risher set a Medina County receiving record for yards receiving in a single game. Risher totalled 266 yards receiving in the Grizzlies 37-31 come-from-behind victory over the Wooster Generals.

#### GRIZZLIES STILL CELEBRATING MR. FOOTBALL

2018 Wadsworth graduate, Joey Baughman, will forever be considered an Ohio football legend. The quarterback's jaw-dropping accomplishments in the 2017 season were impossible to ignore and in November of last year he was named Mr. Football as the state's top player.

Previous winners include NFL players Mitchell Trubisky (Mentor, 2012), Delone Carter (Copley, 2005), Tyrell Sutton (Archbishop Hoban, 2004), Maurice Claret (Warren Harding, 2001), Tony Fisher (Euclid, 1997), Andy Katzenmoyer (Westerville South, 1995), Charles Woodson (Fremont Ross, 1995), Curtis Enis (Mississinawa Valley, 1993), Mark Edwards (Norwood, 1992), Bobby Hoying (St. Henry, 1990) and Robert Smith (Euclid, 1989, '90).

Baughman led Wadsworth to its first undefeated regular season since 1996 and fifth overall. The Grizzlies also won their first Suburban League title since 2009 — they dominated seven SL National Conference opponents by an average of 28 points — and broke Medina County records for points (589) and scoring average (49.1).

The 6-foot-1, 192-pound Baughman ended the season with 3,060 yards passing, 1,533 yards rushing and 56 total touchdowns (36 passing, 20 rushing) despite Wadsworth playing seven games with a running clock in the second half.

Baughman passed on a wrestling scholarship to the University of Virginia, instead electing to play quarterback for Elon University, an on-the-rise Football Championship Subdivision school in North Carolina.

## HEAD COACH MIKE BELL

HIRED FEBRUARY 4, 2015

Mike Bell is in his fourth year as coach of the Tigers and is looking to build on his past successes, bringing winning football back to Twinsburg.

Prior to coming to Twinsburg, Bell served one year as the head coach at Eastlake North and had a very successful 12-year run as head coach at Lake Catholic in Mentor.

In 12 seasons at Lake Catholic, the Cougars won 6 NCL Championships, qualified for the state playoffs 8 times (playoff record of 17-8) with 5 Regional Title appearances (2003, 2006, 2007, 2009, 2010) and 3 state semifinal appearances (2007, 2009, and 2010).

Prior to 2002, Bell served as the Cougars' defensive coordinator for three seasons, winning the Division III State Championship in 2001.

Prior to coaching at Lake Catholic, Bell spent three years at Willoughby South as a position coach and defensive coordinator, four years at Maple Heights, and two seasons at his alma mater Pymatuning Valley.

## GRIDIRON CLUB

Twinsburg coach Mike Bell has always been a strong believer in building a program and not just simply a football team that competes on Friday night.

Part of that is the involvement of those outside of the players and coaches, including the administration, the community and perhaps most importantly, the football parents.

Bell said the Tigers are extremely lucky to have the support of The Gridiron Club at Twinsburg and he doesn't take it for granted.

"It starts with our administration doing a great job getting our young men the equipment and necessities for the game, but when you think about all the extras to make us a first-class program that is where the Gridiron Club comes in and really helps us," Bell said.

"There are a million ways for parents to get involved and I always encourage parents to get involved and do what they can because it doesn't last forever at the high school level obviously. The years go fast."

The Gridiron Club is an organization of football parents in grades 7 through 12. There is no fee to join and all members of the community are welcome to attend meetings. The Club meets the second Monday of the month at Twinsburg High School. Meetings begin at 6:00 p.m. All of the fundraising is run through Twinsburg Athletic Boosters.

The Gridiron Club raises funds to help support the team off the turf. From purchasing a new sound system for the locker room to feeding the boys on Friday nights and scrimmages, purchasing football gear such as t-shirts and cinch bags, senior gifts and hosting the end of year banquet. These events are important in developing a sense of unity and pride in the program.

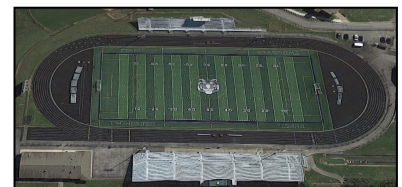

Twinsburg Tiger Stadium is one of the most used athletic facilities in Northeast Ohio. Twinsburg officials say Tiger Stadium's field gets used upwards of 950 times each year for various athletic events and practices -- from football, to soccer, to regional sporting events.

In the summer of 2015, the Stadium received a major upgrade to the playing surface. New field turf was installed featuring a unique blue border and a large Tiger logo at midfield. The 'grass' has a "paneled" look of lighter and darker green shades every five yards replacing the carpet that was installed in 2005.

Tiger Stadium has become a perennial site for OHSAA football playoff games, hosting two games last year - the Division I Region 1 Semifinal (St Edward vs Stow) and the Division II Region 5 Final (Hudson and Warren Harding)

## 1ST AND 10 WITH ROBERT MARQUARD

### MARQUARD IS RESPONSIBLE FOR TIGER STADIUM OPERATIONS

#### 1 - What is your background and how did you get involved with stadium operations?

I am currently the night custodian at RBC, but was the groundskeeper for the Brooklyn City Schools for a couple years. The experience from Brooklyn made me fit in with helping the Twinsburg maintenance staff.

#### 2 - What is the one part of your job that perhaps people don't realize/recognize is critical to the Friday night experience?

Every part of my job is critical on Friday nights and most people don't realize the behind the scenes activities there are to getting the game off on time and running smoothly. Anything from getting the officials set up, making sure the teams are where they are supposed to be, parking the visiting team's player and band buses in the appropriate lot, and of course having the game go off as scheduled. All of this and much more is done unbeknownst to the crowd which is great because we just want them to enjoy the game.

#### 3 - Are you able to be a fan on Friday nights or do you have in-game responsibilities?

Of course I'm a big fan of Twinsburg football and actually all their sports and want all of them to be successful. That's why we work so hard to get the game off without a hitch. Unfortunately, I don't have a lot of time to enjoy the game. I rely on Mr. Fantone to give me updates over the radios we use during the game.

#### 4 - Are there any aspects of visiting stadiums you use as a basis for getting Tiger Stadium ready on game night?

I have seen how other teams prepare their fields for games and have friends who coach that help give me ideas and working for another school district was a benefit. Watching NFL and college games make you think of ways for a better football experience. Bottom line here is that we want people to come to Twinsburg enjoy a football game and see what we have to offer.

## THIS DATE IN HISTORY

**OCTOBER 12, 1989:** The Herschel Walker trade was the largest player trade in the history of the National Football League. This deal, on October 12, 1989, centered around sending running back Herschel Walker from the Dallas Cowboys to the Minnesota Vikings. Including Walker and a transaction involving the San Diego Chargers, the trade eventually involved 18 players and draft picks.

At the time of the deal, the Cowboys were one of the worst teams in the league (the team finished the 1989 season with its worst post-merger record, 1-15), trading away their best player, while the Vikings believed that Walker was the missing piece they needed to make a Super Bowl run. Thus, Minnesota originally felt that they got the better end of the deal. Instead, the Cowboys used the draft picks acquired in this trade to get the players they needed to help them win three Super Bowls in the 1990s, including Emmitt Smith, Russell Maryland, Alonzo Highsmith, and Darren Woodson.

Meanwhile, the Vikings did not make a Super Bowl appearance with Walker. The ultimate irony to this trade is that the Cowboys picked Walker back up during the Free Agency period in 1996 and he would finish out his career in 1997 with the Cowboys.
