Add shading.</p>	<p>Window Observation. Pick a window from your house. Draw what you see outside of it, including your window frame. Try to include window reflections.</p>	<p>Graffiti name tag. Draw a unique name tag using graffiti bubble letters. Use the entire size of your paper. Design the background for bonus.</p>	<p>Animals in clothes. Draw an animal of your choice in human clothing. Add a unique design to their clothes.</p>

What do you think art is? What is bad art?</p>	<p>Find out more. What is your favorite toy, poster, car, or artwork? Try to find out who designed it, why was it made, and what it was made with.</p>	<p>Artsology. Check out Artsology Games to play art games and learn about several artists. Record the name of the game you played and some facts about the artist you learned about.</p>
