Minutes from the August 27, 2019 meeting were approved.

Update from the Board Members – Matt Cellura & Rob Felber:

- School is in full swing and it has been a very busy year already.
- *Conceptual Legacy Project* and the *Strategic Plan* are two of the biggest things the District is working on right now.
- One successful community forum addressing the *Conceptual Legacy Project* was already held and more are scheduled. The District welcomes feedback from the community to see what they are willing to support and what is important to the families.
- The *Strategic Plan* will be discussed at a Board Work Session tonight and will be voted on for approval.

Update from the CVCC – Toni Cluse, Career Specialist:

- Toni Cluse is the Twinsburg City School District Career Specialist supporting everyone in K-12. She started in January 2019 and is employed with the Cuyahoga Valley Career Center (CVCC).
- CVCC services 8 school district (Brecksville-Broadview Heights, Cuyahoga Heights, Garfield Heights, Independence, Nordonias Hills, North Royalton, Revere, and Twinsburg). 30 career tech programs are offered and there are about 900 students enrolled.
- CVCC also offers programs to adults with about 1,000 adults taking advantage of the programs.
- About 60% of the students enrolled in a program at the CVCC will pursue higher education after graduating.

- Students will enroll in the programs for their Junior and Senior years of high school.
- Many of the programs will offer 6 to 18 hours of college credit in addition to students being able to earn credentials in their fields of study.
- CVCC also offers students Career Planning & Development.
