## THE OPENING DRIVE

Twinsburg is coming off a tough 35-28 loss to a talented Copley squad and goes on the road for the first time in 2016 when the Tigers travel to Stewart Field to tangle with the 1-0 Solon Comets.

While a slow start hurt Twinsburg's chances against Copley, Solon senior quarterback Joe Bubonics could not have asked for a better start vs. Aurora. Short field position and a quick touchdown pass in his first football game as the Comets' starter sent Solon soaring to a 36-6 victory at Aurora's Veterans Stadium.

Bubonics started the last two years at cornerback, but finished the game passing for 245 yards on 13 of 17 attempts. The 5-foot-9 signal caller threw four touchdown passes, his main targets were Darryl Sinclair and Jake McCurry. Solon scored on its first three possessions and built a 22-0 lead on the Greenmen.

"(Aurora) Coach (Bob) Mihalik teams don't get beat like that so it shows you how talented Solon is," Twinsburg coach Mike Bell said. "For us, we are approaching the game that we need to get better and play our game. We are not going to take it any other place. This game is about us, about cleaning some things up and playing hard for 48 minutes."

As always, QB Jalen Tucker will be asked to do quite a bit for Twinsburg vs. Solon. Wide receiver Christian Edgerson is coming off a big game vs. Copley, including a long TD reception and a kickoff return for a score. Defensively, James Grammens, Cam Ron McClain and Josh Flask will be among the players asked to slow down a potent Solon attack.

## CENTURY MARK CLOSE FOR BELL

Twinsburg coach Mike Bell is one win away from reaching 100 career wins.

Bell had huge success as head coach of Lake Catholic from 2002-2013 and had one year at Eastlake North before taking over the Tigers before the 2015 season.

"It is a special number and there are a lot of phenomenal coaches who have reached that number," Bell said. "To have the opportunity to achieve that goal says a lot about the coaches I have coached with and the great players I have been lucky enough to be around."

Playing the game with passion, being a great teammate, doing everything with passion.

Everyone has dreams of being great, but to actually go out and make it happen through hard work is something we strive for. It has to do with effort.

"The nice thing is individually we control all of those things in PCE," Bell said.

## TIGERS RECAP

### Tigers Comeback Falls Just Short

 **Copley INDIANS** 35

 **Twinsburg TIGERS** 28

Week 1, August 26, 2016, Tigers Stadium

Michigan State recruit Weston Bridges scored four touchdowns, leading Copley to a 35-28 win against the host Tigers.



Copley scored four first-half touchdowns and led 28-7 at the break. Twinsburg got a 52-yard TD pass from Jalen Tucker to Tre Radford in the second quarter.

Twinsburg rallied for two second-half scores and pulled to within a touchdown with the ball but was unable to get any closer. The Tigers got an 18-yard TD pass from Tucker to James Bessett and an 83-yard strike from Tucker to Christian Edgerson to narrow the gap.

Following another Bridges TD run, Edgerson's 94-yard kick return in the second half accounted for the final scoring, but Twinsburg couldn't catch the Indians.

"We started slow, which was a trend in our scrimmages as well, but once we started playing football the way I know we can we were right there, and I think from a talent perspective we can play with anyone," Twinsburg coach Mike Bell said.

"We have to figure out a way to play 48 minutes of football. If we do that, I think we can be a very good team. It's not about talent. We have the guys to compete ...

Overall, all three phases of the game, this was the best game we have played since I have been coach of this team and it hurts because we didn't win, but we are getting there."

### STERLING AT STEWART FIELD

Since Coach McQuaide took over the Comets in 2003, his teams have posted a record of 61-10 (.859) at Stewart Field.

Over the last thirteen seasons, Solon has hosted six first round playoff games and has been victorious in each. Three of this year's seven Greater Cleveland Conference matchups will be played at Solon.

Coach McQuaide credits the Solon faithful for making Stewart Field one of the hardest places for a visiting team to play in Northeast Ohio

### COMETS TRENDS & STREAKS

Significant trends have followed the Solon Comets over the last thirteen seasons.

Most substantially is that the program is 51-0 when rushing for 200 or more yards in a game.

In games where the Comets have the lead at the end of the third quarter, they are 97-3.

Look for continued consistency in 2016.

### EXPERIENCE RUNS DEEP

Solon returns 18 players with significant Friday night experience as either a starter or alternate in 2015.

Darryl Sinclair, Melvin Jackson, Jake McCurry, Joe Bubonics, Anthony Zavarella, Matt Brown, Maurice Ashford, Chris Glaser, Zach Beder, Jacob Gross, Nate Westrich, Ryan McCurry, Casey Maniglia, Andrew Mason, and Nate Leskovec all saw significant time as starters at their respective positions.

Taj Ward, Devon Brown, and Jalen Brown were alternates on the team a year ago and will enter this season having played many valuable minutes on the field.

Six of these 18 players were starters in 2014 and have been tremendous contributors to the team.

## HEAD COACH MIKE BELL

Hired February 4, 2015

Mike Bell is entering his second year as coach of the Tigers and is looking to build on his past successes, bringing winning football back to Twinsburg.

Prior to coming to Twinsburg, Bell served one year as the head coach at Eastlake North and had a very successful 12-year run as head coach at Lake Catholic in Mentor.

In 12 seasons at Lake Catholic, the Cougars won 6 NCL Championships, qualified for the state playoffs 8 times (playoff record of 17-8) with 5 Regional Title appearances (2003, 2006, 2007, 2009, 2010) and 3 state semifinal appearances (2007, 2009, and 2010).

Prior to 2002, Bell served as the Cougars' defensive coordinator for three seasons, winning the Division III State Championship in 2001.

Prior to coaching at Lake Catholic, Bell spent three years at Willoughby South as a position coach and defensive coordinator, four years at Maple Heights, and two seasons at his alma mater Pymatuning Valley.

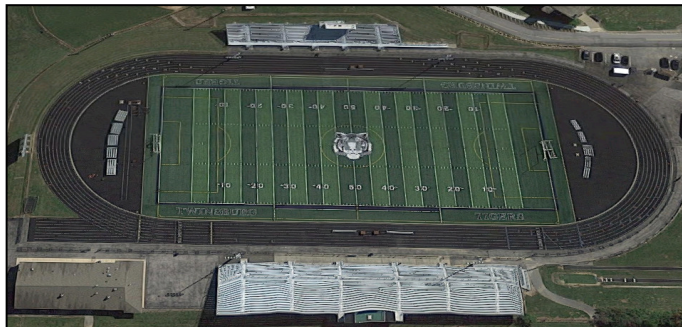

Twinsburg Tiger Stadium is one of the most used athletic facilities in Northeast Ohio. Twinsburg officials say Tiger Stadium's field gets used upwards of 950 times each year for various athletic events and practices -- from football, to soccer, to Relay For Life, to regional sporting events.

In the summer of 2015, the Stadium received a major upgrade to the playing surface. New field turf was installed featuring a unique blue border and a large Tiger logo at midfield. The 'grass' has a "paneled" look of lighter and darker green shades every five yards, replacing a the carpet that was layed in 2005.

Tiger Stadium has become perennial site for OHSAA football playoff games, hosting two games last year including the Region 23 championship game.

## THIS DATE IN SPORTS HISTORY

**September 2, 2006** - Cleveland Indians rookie Kevin Kouzmanoff hit a grand slam off of then-Texas Rangers Edison Volquez on the first pitch he ever saw in the major leagues, the first player in MLB history ever to do so on the first pitch. (The first-pitch slam feat was equalled by Red Sox outfielder Daniel Nava in 2005)

**September 2, 2002** - Oakland wins its 19th straight game and ties AL record set in 1906 and 1947. The winning streak is detailed in the 2011 Brad Pitt movie *Moneyball*.

**September 2, 1999** - Baltimore Orioles 3B Cal Ripken hits his 400th HR – the 29th MLB player to do so.
