THE OPENING DRIVE

Twinsburg is coming off its first victory of the season and will go for back-to-back wins in a Week 5 road contest at undefeated Brecksville-Broadview Heights.

The Bees (4-0, 1-0 Suburban National) routed the Cuyahoga Falls Black Tigers (1-3, 0-1) in Week 4, 41-7.

BBH has been one of the most consistent programs in the area over the last few years. This season is no different, guided by head coach Jason Black. In the win over Cuyahoga Falls, the Bees relied on senior quarterback Luke Strnad early and often. Strnad started the scoring by tossing a 12-yard pass to senior Joey McGonegal to take an early 7-0 lead. After the Bees defense forced a turnover, Strnad connected with junior receiver Sam Wiglusz to take a 13-0 lead into the second quarter.

The second quarter was equally dominant for Brecksville-Broadview Heights. After junior safety Mike Rose's interception, junior Alec Buckley capitalized with a 7-yard touchdown run to give the Bees a 20-0 lead. Strnad found his senior tight end Victor Bierman for a 3-yard touchdown with 48 seconds remaining to extend the lead to 27-0 entering halftime and cruised to a fourth straight win.

"They are a very dynamic football team," Twinsburg coach Mike Bell said. "They are creative with their offensive scheme and play hard and fast on defense. What I am most impressed with is how hard Coach Jason Black gets them to play."

Twinsburg is getting an All-Ohio type of season from junior wideout Christian Edgerson, who had three touchdowns in four touches against North Royalton. Sophomore Adam Van de Motter and senior Jalen Tucker have both seen time at quarterback and both are capable playmakers. Tre Radford is a promising sophomore receiver for the Tigers.

Junior linebacker James Grammens had a breakout game in the win over North Royalton. Isaiah Savitt is an up-and-coming sophomore linebacker for Twinsburg. The Tigers are allowing 35 points per game.

TIGERS RECAP

Tigers Get Win #1; Bell #100

Twinsburg TIGERS 28

North Royalton BEARS 27

Week 4, September 16, 2016, Serpentine Chevrolet Stadium

Twinsburg rolled up 430 yards of offense and got a huge performance from Christian Edgerson as the Tigers won their first game of the season with a 28-27 victory at North Royalton on Sept. 16.

Edgerson touched the ball four times during the game, but three of those touches resulted in TDs for Twinsburg (1-3).

Adam Van de Motter threw for 162 yards and two touchdowns for the Tigers, including a 14-yard strike to Tre Radford to open the scoring in the first quarter.

Big plays kept the Bears in the game as a North Royalton struck in the first half with a 94-yard kickoff return for a score and an 84-yard TD pass.

A 50-yard run by Edgerson in the second quarter gave Twinsburg a 14-7 edge, but the Bears tied the game before halftime.

A 48-yard TD run and a 21-yard touchdown catch by Edgerson in the third quarter pushed the Tigers out to a 28-14 lead and they were able to withstand a rally by North Royalton, which missed a critical extra point after the final TD of the game in the third quarter.

Edgerson finished with 106 yards rushing on three carries and two scores. He had one catch for 21 yards and a TD.

The victory was the 100th career win for Twinsburg coach Mike Bell.

COACH BELL REACHES MILESTONE WIN

Bell won his 100th career game with a 28-27 victory over North Royalton on Sept. 16.

Bell's first win came in 2002 at Lake Catholic.

"To be honest, it is kind of a big relief to have finally gotten that 100th win out of the way," Bell said. "It seems as though it's been a monkey on the back for a while. I can tell you this, I did not do it alone. Every player and coach that I have had the opportunity to work with is responsible for this achievement. It has caused me to do a little reflecting and reminiscing and to realize just how blessed I am to do what I do."

13 is a Lucky Number for Brecksville... in gymnastics

Another OHSAA sports is dominating the trophy cases at Brecksville High School. The Bees girls gymnastics team has built a dynasty, winning 13 consecutive OHSAA state championships in the team all-around. Overall, the squad has won 16 championships dating back to 1994.

The football team captured its lone state title in 1983

The Tupa Name Still Tops At Brecksville

Brecksville alumni Tom Tupa is a former quarterback and punter in the National Football League.

In Tupa's senior season with Brecksville, he led the Bees to the school's only football state championship. Tupa also lettered in basketball and baseball.

After sitting three seasons behind Mike Tomczak and Jim Karsatos, Tupa took over the starting quarterback job at Ohio State University in 1987, throwing for 2,252 yards, 15 touchdowns and 12 interceptions. He was selected as an All-American punter in the same season, as well as All-Big 10. Tupa was a four-time football letterman and was also selected to play in the 1988 Hula Bowl all-star game.

Tupa was drafted in the third round (68th overall) of the 1988 NFL Draft by the Phoenix Cardinals.

He played four seasons with the Cardinals before joining the Indianapolis Colts in 1992 as a backup quarterback.

Tupa joined the Browns in 1994 and during that season was the first NFL player to score a two-point conversion, when the league allowed for the new scoring attempt on PATs.

Tupa also played for the New England Patriots, the New York Jets and the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, earning a Super Bowl Ring in January of 2003 as the Bucs beat the Raiders in Super Bowl XXXVIII. Tupa retired following the 2005 season.

HEAD COACH MIKE BELL

Hired February 4, 2015

Mike Bell is in his second year as coach of the Tigers and is looking to build on his past successes, bringing winning football back to Twinsburg.

Prior to coming to Twinsburg, Bell served one year as the head coach at Eastlake North and had a very successful 12-year run as head coach at Lake Catholic in Mentor.

In 12 seasons at Lake Catholic, the Cougars won 6 NCL Championships, qualified for the state playoffs 8 times (playoff record of 17-8) with 5 Regional Title appearances (2003, 2006, 2007, 2009, 2010) and 3 state semifinal appearances (2007, 2009, and 2010).

Prior to 2002, Bell served as the Cougars' defensive coordinator for three seasons, winning the Division III State Championship in 2001.

Prior to coaching at Lake Catholic, Bell spent three years at Willoughby South as a position coach and defensive coordinator, four years at Maple Heights, and two seasons at his alma mater Pymatuning Valley.

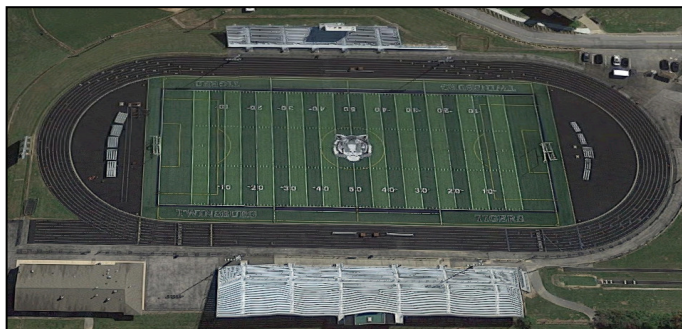

Twinsburg Tiger Stadium is one of the most used athletic facilities in Northeast Ohio. Twinsburg officials say Tiger Stadium's field gets used upwards of 950 times each year for various athletic events and practices -- from football, to soccer, to Relay For Life, to regional sporting events.

In the summer of 2015, the Stadium received a major upgrade to the playing surface. New field turf was installed featuring a unique blue border and a large Tiger logo at midfield. The 'grass' has a "paneled" look of lighter and darker green shades every five yards replacing a the carpet that was installed in 2005.

Tiger Stadium has become a perennial site for OHSAA football playoff games, hosting two games last year including the Region 23 championship game.

1ST AND TEN WITH CHRIS SHAFFER

Shaffer is the linebackers coach for the Tigers & the head coach of the freshman team

1. As a longtime resident of Twinsburg what does it mean to coach at the high school?

THIS DATE IN SPORTS HISTORY

September 23, 2006 - San Francisco Giants outfielder Barry Bonds hits his 734th HR in the National League, breaking the NL record held by Hank Aaron.

September 23, 1988 - Oakland A's outfield and designated hitter Jose Canseco is the first player in MLB history to steal 40 bases and hit 40 home runs in the same season. Since then, three other players have done it - Barry Bonds, Alex Rodriguez, and Alphonso Soriano .

September 23, 1953 - Rocky Marciano became the world heavyweight boxing champion by knocking out Jersey Joe Walcott in the 13th round, in Philadelphia PA. It was Marciano's 43rd consecutive victory. This was the 1st closed circuit pay-TV telecast of a sports event; the fight was shown on 46 movies screens in 31 cities around the United States.
