THE OPENING DRIVE

Twinsburg closed the 2016 season with a rush of momentum, winning its final three games.

If the Tigers are going to make it four straight, they will have to earn it on the road against a perennial playoff qualifier.

Twinsburg will open the 2017 campaign at Copley in a Suburban League interdivision contest.

In the season opener last year, the Indians defeated the Tigers, 35-28, on its way to an 8-3 record. Copley looks to make their third straight playoff appearance after losing several players due to graduation.

Senior linemen Vince Fonte and Andrew Martin should offer support with their size in the trenches as Copley returns six starters in its spread offense. Returning defensive end Adam Allen, and linebackers Blake Traylor and Bryce Taylor will anchor the Indians' defense in their final season. The Taylors combined for 95 solo tackles.

For Twinsburg, senior captain Cam'Ron McClain is a talented running back who can move the chains and find the end zone. Adam Van de Motter gained valuable experience at QB in 2016, sharing time with Jalen Tucker who has graduated.

The Tigers have three big targets at receiver—juniors James Besett, Tre Radford and senior Christian Edgeron.

On defense, linebacker James Grammens is one of the top playmakers in the Suburban League. Isaiah Savitt had a big year on defense last season and looks to carry over to this fall. Aiden Malencheck has emerged as a difference maker on the defensive line for the Tigers.

With upcoming games against powerhouses Solon and Aurora the next two weeks, a win at Copley would be key to setting the tone for the season for Twinsburg and also earn critical computer points in a push for the playoffs.

TIGERS RECAP

**Tigers Finished 2016 Strong;
Look to Carry Momentum into 2017**

Twinsburg will have plenty of momentum heading into the 2017 season after the way the Tigers closed 2016 with a three-game winning streak.

Twinsburg lost six of its first seven games in 2016, but rallied to finish at 4-6 and in 13th place in a brutal Division II, Region 5 by closing with wins over Hudson, Nordonia and Cuyahoga Falls. Hudson not only made the playoffs, but advanced to the Division II state semifinals making the Tigers' win over the Explorers the signature moment of 2016.

"We're teaching and coaching a certain brand and a way of doing things and we keep telling them if you buy in you will experience success and they did that at the end of last year which I think shows maturity and growth," Twinsburg coach Mike Bell said.

"As a result of the success at the end of last year the momentum carried over to the weight room in the spring and summer for our guys. They were excited to get in there and are looking forward to this season."

Quarterbacks Jalen Tucker and Adam Van de Motter each played a pivotal role in the late-season success for the Tigers. Junior linebacker James Grammens emerged as one of the top defensive players in the Suburban League and will be a team captain and a leader as a senior in 2017.

"James Grammens had a tremendous junior season and in my opinion is one of the top defensive players in our league," Bell said.

Isaiah Savitt finished with 80 tackles and three sacks for Twinsburg as well.

After losses to three playoff teams to start 2016 – Copley, Solon and Aurora – Twinsburg went on the road and got its first victory of the season at North Royalton, 28-27.

"The games against Solon and Aurora we were just out-physicaled, out-everything, so it was good to see the young men bounce back and win a game in Week 4 where we needed to play all 48 minutes to get it done," Bell said.

Copley Indians Team Notes

ORIGINAL MEMBER OF THE SUBURBAN LEAGUE

Currently, the Suburban League has 15 members, with seven teams in the American Division.

The Copley Indians are the longest consecutive member of the league, being one of three founding members currently in the conference. 2016 is the 68th season of Copley as a member of the Suburban League.

Copley joined the Suburban League in 1949, one of six teams forming a new league when teams departed the Summit County League.

Current Suburban League - National Division members Nordonia and Hudson were also members of the original six schools to form the Suburban League in the post-World War II era

INDIANS ALUM - DELONE CARTER

Since 1987, The Associated Press has given out the annual Mr. Football Award in the state of Ohio.

Following the 2005 season, Copley running back, Delone Carter was named Ohio's Mr. Football.

After graduating from Copley, Carter attended the University of Syracuse, where he rushed for over 3,000 yards and 28 touchdowns in his career.

This included a 198-yard performance in the inaugural PinStripe Bowl played at Yankee Stadium on December 30, 2010

Carter was selected by the Indianapolis Colts in the 4th round (119th overall pick) of the 2011 NFL Draft.

Two years later, Carter was traded by the Colts to the Baltimore Ravens and ended his career with the Jacksonville Jaguars in 2014.

For his career, Carter gained just under 500 yards and scored five touchdowns.

HEAD COACH MIKE BELL

Hired February 4, 2015

Mike Bell is in his third year as coach of the Tigers and is looking to build on his past successes, bringing winning football back to Twinsburg.

Prior to coming to Twinsburg, Bell served one year as the head coach at Eastlake North and had a very successful 12-year run as head coach at Lake Catholic in Mentor.

In 12 seasons at Lake Catholic, the Cougars won 6 NCL Championships, qualified for the state playoffs 8 times (playoff record of 17-8) with 5 Regional Title appearances (2003, 2006, 2007, 2009, 2010) and 3 state semifinal appearances (2007, 2009, and 2010).

Prior to 2002, Bell served as the Cougars' defensive coordinator for three seasons, winning the Division III State Championship in 2001.

Prior to coaching at Lake Catholic, Bell spent three years at Willoughby South as a position coach and defensive coordinator, four years at Maple Heights, and two seasons at his alma mater Pymatuning Valley.

GRIDIRON CLUB

Twinsburg coach Mike Bell has always been a strong believer in building a program and not just simply a football team that competes on Friday night.

Part of that is the involvement of those outside of the players and coaches, including the administration, the community and perhaps most importantly, the football parents.

Bell said the Tigers are extremely lucky to have the support of The Gridiron Club at Twinsburg and he doesn't take it for granted.

"It starts with our administration doing a great job getting our young men the equipment and necessities for the game, but when you think about all the extras to make us a first-class program that is where the Gridiron Club comes in and really help us," Bell said.

"There are a million ways for parents to get involved and I always encourage parents to get involved and do what they can because it doesn't last forever at the high school level obviously. The years go fast."

The Gridiron Club is an organization of football parents in grades 7 through 12. There is no fee to join and all members of the community are welcome to attend meetings. The Club meets the second Monday of the month at Twinsburg High School. Meetings begin at 6:00 p.m. All of the fundraising is run through Twinsburg Athletic Boosters.

The Gridiron Club raises funds to help support the team off the turf. From purchasing a new sound system for the locker room to feeding the boys on Friday nights and scrimmages, purchasing football gear such as t-shirts and cinch bags, senior gifts and hosting the end of year banquet. These events are important in developing a sense of unity and pride in the program.

Twinsburg Tiger Stadium is one of the most used athletic facilities in Northeast Ohio. Twinsburg officials say Tiger Stadium's field gets used upwards of 950 times each year for various athletic events and practices -- from football, to soccer, to Relay For Life, to regional sporting events.

In the summer of 2015, the Stadium received a major upgrade to the playing surface. New field turf was installed featuring a unique blue border and a large Tiger logo at midfield. The 'grass' has a "paneled" look of lighter and darker green shades every five yards replacing a carpet that was installed in 2005.

Tiger Stadium has become a perennial site for OHSAA football playoff games, hosting two games last year - the Division I Region 1 Semifinal (St Edward vs Stow) and the Division II Region 5 Final (Hudson and Warren Harding)

1ST AND TEN WITH GRIDIRON CLUB

GRIDIRON CLUB MEMBERS THEA SAKO, ANNEMARIE GRAMMENS AND PAM CALLOW

1 – How long have you been involved in the Club and why is it important to be involved and serve as more than just a casual fan?

A - We have been involved in Twinsburg Football since the middle school days. When Coach Bell arrived, we became more organized as a parent group and more involved in helping Twinsburg Football move to the next level. Volunteerism instills a sense of community and giving back. It is the hope that we can be role models to our sons and other players on the team. The message of the importance of doing for others is a trait we hope that we model for the boys.

2 – What is something the community should know about the Gridiron Club that maybe they don't know?
