THE OPENING DRIVE

Twinsburg will try to end the season on a winning note as the Tigers host Nordonia in a Week 10 matchup.

Twinsburg is 3-6 on the season and have lost five straight. The Knights are 2-7 and have won 2 of 3 after starting 0-6.

Nordonia is coming off a loss to North Royalton in which Bears senior running back Jake Francak had a big night on both sides of the ball, with 22 carries for 111 yards and four touchdowns, and 17 tackles on defense Friday.

However, Nordonia would not go down without a fight. Junior running back Nyles Beverly started the rally by rushing for a two-yard touchdown with 3:29 left in third quarter. The Knights would score again on a flea-flicker from Robby Levak to Donny Wizniak, and converted the ensuing two-point try to cut their deficit to 21-18 with 7:40 left. Levak went 17-of-27 passing for 318 yards, a touchdown and two interceptions. He also had 12 rushes for 48 yards. Senior running back Tye Evans had five catches for 95 yards, Wizniak had three catches for 104 yards and a touchdown, and Beverly had six carries for 25 yards and a touchdown.

Nordonia averages 25.8 points per game, but have struggled defensively this season. Twinsburg continues to rack up plenty of yards from scrimmage, but the Tigers have not won since Week 4 at Cuyahoga Falls.

Both quarterbacks Seth Grabowski and Adam Van de Motter have had productive seasons. Cam/Ron McClain is a 1,000-yard back who has been very consistent all season. Tre Radford, Christian Edgeron and Isaiah Savitt are all playmakers in the passing game.

Defensively, James Gramens and Kyle Apple lead the linebackers for the Tigers. Rashad Land-Jones, Khadafi Taylor and James Bessett have been steady on that side of the ball all season for Twinsburg.

"It's week 10, it's Nordonia, and we are at home. I'm not sure if anymore needs to be said. Jeff Fox does a great job and I know he will have his team ready to play on Friday. We must focus on the little details this week, take care of the ball on offense, cover and tackle in our kicking game, and get the stops on defense when we need them."

Tigers Drop Fifth Consecutive Game

Twinsburg played powerhouse Hudson to a tie at halftime before falling to the Explorers, 27-17, on Oct. 20.

The Tigers lost their fifth straight game after starting the season 3-1.

Hudson got a big boost from special teams in the game with two field goals from Grant Gonya and a kickoff return for a TD by Dawson Wervey.

Twinsburg got touchdown passes from both Seth Grabowski and Adam Van de Motter. James Bessett and Isaiah Savitt were on the receiving end of the TD throws in the second quarter which helped the Tigers take a 17-14 lead.

Hudson (7-2) tied the game at 17 going to the half and after a scoreless third quarter, the Explorers put up 10 points in the fourth to secure the victory.

Cam'Ron McClain rushed 26 times for 161 yards in the loss for Twinsburg. The Tigers outgained Hudson, 406-273.

KNIGHTS FOOTBALL HISTORY:

The Knights have made the playoffs 12 times in school history and three times since Jeff Fox took over the program in 2011.

The Knights have appeared in two state championship games, coming up short in both 2002 and 2014 against Dayton Chaminade-Julianne and Cincinnati LaSalle

JORDAN MABIN - MR FOOTBALL 2006

In 2006, the Nordonia Knights had an individual join an exclusive club, as senior running back Jordan Mabin was named 'Mr Football' for the state of Ohio that season. Mabin rushed for more than 2,300 yards and for his career topped the 6,700-yard mark

Defensively, totaled 143 career tackles (123 solos) and 11 interceptions.

Mabin played his college football at Northwestern and during his redshirt freshman year with the Wildcats, he had 52 total tackles and three interceptions for the year. Mabin subsequently earned multiple All-Freshman honors, as he was named to FWAA's Freshman All-America team and Sporting News' Freshman All-American team.

After graduating from Northwestern, Mabin signed as an undrafted free agent with the Baltimore Ravens and spent part of the 2012 season on the Ravens practice squad.

Mabin also signed contracts with the Cleveland Browns, Atlanta Falcons and the San Diego Chargers and played in two games for the Montreal Alouettes of the Canadian Football League.

HEAD COACH MIKE BELL

Hired February 4, 2015

Mike Bell is in his third year as coach of the Tigers and is looking to build on his past successes, bringing winning football back to Twinsburg.

Prior to coming to Twinsburg, Bell served one year as the head coach at Eastlake North and had a very successful 12-year run as head coach at Lake Catholic in Mentor.

In 12 seasons at Lake Catholic, the Cougars won 6 NCL Championships, qualified for the state playoffs 8 times (playoff record of 17-8) with 5 Regional Title appearances (2003, 2006, 2007, 2009, 2010) and 3 state semifinal appearances (2007, 2009, and 2010).

Prior to 2002, Bell served as the Cougars' defensive coordinator for three seasons, winning the Division III State Championship in 2001.

Prior to coaching at Lake Catholic, Bell spent three years at Willoughby South as a position coach and defensive coordinator, four years at Maple Heights, and two seasons at his alma mater Pymatuning Valley.

GRIDIRON CLUB

Twinsburg coach Mike Bell has always been a strong believer in building a program and not just simply a football team that competes on Friday night.

Part of that is the involvement of those outside of the players and coaches, including the administration, the community and perhaps most importantly, the football parents.

Bell said the Tigers are extremely lucky to have the support of The Gridiron Club at Twinsburg and he doesn't take it for granted.

"It starts with our administration doing a great job getting our young men the equipment and necessities for the game, but when you think about all the extras to make us a first-class program that is where the Gridiron Club comes in and really help us," Bell said.

"There are a million ways for parents to get involved and I always encourage parents to get involved and do what they can because it doesn't last forever at the high school level obviously. The years go fast."

The Gridiron Club is an organization of football parents in grades 7 through 12. There is no fee to join and all members of the community are welcome to attend meetings. The Club meets the second Monday of the month at Twinsburg High School. Meetings begin at 6:00 p.m. All of the fundraising is run through Twinsburg Athletic Boosters.

The Gridiron Club raises funds to help support the team off the turf. From purchasing a new sound system for the locker room to feeding the boys on Friday nights and scrimmages, purchasing football gear such as t-shirts and cinch bags, senior gifts and hosting the end of year banquet. These events are important in developing a sense of unity and pride in the program.

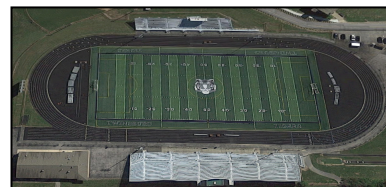

Twinsburg Tiger Stadium is one of the most used athletic facilities in Northeast Ohio. Twinsburg officials say Tiger Stadium's field gets used upwards of 950 times each year for various athletic events and practices -- from football, to soccer, to Relay For Life, to regional sporting events.

In the summer of 2015, the Stadium received a major upgrade to the playing surface. New field turf was installed featuring a unique blue border and a large Tiger logo at midfield. The 'grass' has a "paneled" look of lighter and darker green shades every five yards replacing a carpet that was installed in 2005.

Tiger Stadium has become a perennial site for OHSAA football playoff games, hosting two games last year - the Division I Region 1 Semifinal (St Edward vs Stow) and the Division II Region 5 Final (Hudson and Warren Harding)

1st AND 10 WITH DAVID BROWNE

BROWNE IS THE DEFENSIVE LINE COACH AT TWINSBURG HIGH SCHOOL

1 - How did playing college football at Iowa help shape your coaching style and do you share any Big 10 stories with your current players?

A - I attribute most of my coaching philosophies and principles from my Defensive line coach at Iowa - Dan McCamey. He was an Iowa Letterman in the mid 70's, coached there for about 12 years before taking assistant coaching positions at Florida and Wisconsin. He then became the head coach at Iowa State and ended his career recently at North Texas State.

I am also a big fan of Larry Johnson at Ohio State. He has some incredible techniques and drills that I have been doing for about 5 or 6 years now with my players. ... Being new to the staff here at Twinsburg, I have really only shared a few stories to the kids, I've shared more with Coach Bell and the staff. But I'm sure moving forward I will share more with the players.

2 - How much did you learn from being on championship staffs at St. Edward with Coach Finotti?

A - Coach Finotti is the most organized and meticulous coach I have ever worked for. His philosophy is hard work trumps everything else. You will never out work him, his players or coaches, and he requires a lot of self-sacrificing. There are no shortcuts and as a player or coach, you will buy in to his program or you will not be around. Yet the players who play for him love him and the coaches who work for him respect him. He runs practice like a college program and every minute is accounted for. But probably the two things I learned most from him is the weight room is the attitude enhancer and gives kids a swagger to compete against anyone.

Also, you must develop as many players as you can even at the lower levels so they can grasp the culture asap and have a connection with them. Sometimes you have to teach a concept, then reteach it until the players understand it. So my philosophy became 'If you can't learn the way I teach then I'm going to have to teach in a way you will learn'. Even at a school like St. Eds, there are lean years and some of my most memorable years were when we were not projected to do much, but had a group of fighters that simply kept to the grindstone.

3 - What do you see for the future of Twinsburg football not only for the defensive line but for the entire program?

A - I have a ton of respect for Coach Bell. He came to me three years ago about being on the staff but quite honestly, I was a little burned out and wanted a break. Coaching at Eds is usually a 5 or 6 month grind depending on how far you advance in the playoffs. So I really like the staff that he has assembled here. They are hard working men that do their best to give our kids the information to perform on game nights. That being said, we have a tremendous challenge before us as most rebuilding program do. I was fortunate to coach here back in the mid to late 90's when Twinsburg was relevant. I'm not sure of how many of those type of players exist here now, so we are trying to build and spread the word of what we are trying to accomplish, and hopefully, more kids will buy in. but it is a process. In terms of the defensive line, I'm teaching them that playing up front is a game within the game.

First and foremost, they have to learn the fundamentals of the position. We are teaching them hand, feet and eye technique for the position. when I first came aboard the kids looked at me like I was speaking a foreign language, but I am very pleased with their progress. The really good thing is the core group of players will be back for one more year.

4 - Coach Bell has been very complimentary of you as an addition to the staff, with that said what is your coaching philosophy for the guys playing on the defensive line?

A - Typically, I like the outside ends to be athletic guys who can funnel everything back to the middle. They don't have to be the strongest guys, although that helps, but they cannot lose the outside edge and must keep the pressure on offensive tackles. The inside players have to be able command double-teams and fight through double teams using techniques which we teach them. We want to be a read, react and attack style of defensive front.

October 27, 1991 - The Minnesota Twins beat Atlanta Braves 1-0 in 10 innings to win the World Series. Twins pitcher Jack Morris went the distance for the win

October 27, 2004 - The Boston Red Sox win the club's first World Series championship. The Red Sox make the Series by overcoming a 3-games-to-none deficit to the New York Yankees in the American League Championship Series.
