THE OPENING DRIVE

Twinsburg will be riding the emotion of a 35-28 overtime win against Aurora in Week 3 into another road game at Cuyahoga Falls on Sept. 15.

The Black Tigers are still seeking their first win of the season and are coming off a 47-20 loss to Barberton.

Cuyahoga Falls scored 20 unanswered points in the second against Barberton half thanks to the legs of running back Tyler Hitchings and quarterback Tyler Vassolotti. They combined for two rushing touchdowns in the second half and 83 rushing yards on the night. Saivon Davis is a returning all-district performer on defense for the Black Tigers (0-3).

The Tigers are getting contributions from several players on both sides of the ball and in special teams during a 2-1 start to the season. On offense, Seth Grabowski and Adam Van de Motter have both been effective at quarterback. Cam'Ron McClain has been a consistent runner for Twinsburg, while Tre Radford and Christian Edgersen have been dangerous weapons on the outside in the passing game.

On defense, All-Ohio candidate James Grammens and standout linebacker Isaiah Savitt continue to lead the way. Rashad Land-Jones has been an impact player all year for the Tigers on the defensive line.

Twinsburg has won each of the last two meetings against Cuyahoga Falls.

Signature Win For the Tigers

If Twinsburg was looking for a signature win in 2017, the Tigers may have gotten it in Week 3 with a 35-28 overtime victory over host Aurora.

Isaiah Savitt's 5-yard TD run in overtime proved to be the game winner for Twinsburg.

Twinsburg (2-1) lost to the Greenmen, 38-15, in 2016. But this was a much different and favorable outcome for the Tigers.

Aurora used a pair of kickoff returns for touchdowns by Gavin Blunt to take a 14-7 lead.

Blunt added a TD run to give the Greenmen a 21-7 second-quarter advantage before Twinsburg responded with a Cam'Ron McClain scoring run and a Christian Edgerson TD reception from Seth Grabowski to tie the game at 21 at halftime.

Another long touchdown pass from Grabowski to Edgerson gave the Tigers a 28-21 lead in the third quarter. Aurora sent the game to OT with a score in the fourth quarter.

Savitt ran for a touchdown in overtime and the Twinsburg defense made it stand up for the win.

The Tigers ran 92 plays to just 49 for Aurora (0-3). Twinsburg racked up almost 500 yards in the victory. Grabowski threw for two touchdowns and 216 yards for the Tigers.

McClain rushed for 136 yards and a score.

Edgerson caught five passes for 127 yards and two touchdowns, and Tre Radford had five grabs for 84 yards and a TD for Twinsburg.

TIGERS NEW HEAD COACH

Shane Parker is a Black Tiger and darn proud of it. The Cuyahoga Falls head football coach was hired in May and makes no bones about his love for his community.

"This is home. Being around the program as much as I have, I've wanted to be able to give back," Parker said. "These kids deserve to have the kind of experience I had when I was in high school."

Parker is a social studies/criminal justice teacher at the high school.

The new coach made it clear, while he wants to help his players, he also wants to bring winning football back to Cuyahoga Falls.

"The school deserves it. The community deserves it. This town deserves it," Parker said. "Black and gold runs through my veins, so I think I'm the right guy to bring the program back to where it was. I've been there through the high times and the low times at Cuyahoga Falls."

Parker experienced the high times at Falls during his playing career, as he was a starting defensive tackle during Falls' lone playoff game in school history in 2001.

After graduating from Cuyahoga Falls in 2004, Parker became a Division III All-American offensive tackle at Westminster College in New Wilmington, Penn.

Parker graduated from from Westminster in 2008 with a bachelor's degree in history. He also graduated from Kent State University earlier this month with a master's degree in career tech education.

Parker's high school coaching career began at Crestwood High School in 2008, before he spent four years as an assistant at Falls under head coach Mike Miller. Parker then served as Woodridge's offensive coordinator during the 2013 and 2014 seasons, before returning to Falls and serving as defensive coordinator in 2015 and 2016.

"It's always been my goal to be the head coach of Cuyahoga Falls," Parker said. "The fact I've been a coordinator on both sides of the ball, I should be able to find nuances for our players to work with." Defensively, Parker plans to keep Falls' 4-2-5 base scheme in place this fall. He said he's still working on Falls' offensive scheme, which will depend more on personnel.

Parker knows, in terms of on-field success, Falls has nowhere to go but up. The Black Tigers are 1-19 over the last two seasons and have yet to win a game in the National Conference.

HEAD COACH MIKE BELL

Hired February 4, 2015

Mike Bell is in his third year as coach of the Tigers and is looking to build on his past successes, bringing winning football back to Twinsburg.

Prior to coming to Twinsburg, Bell served one year as the head coach at Eastlake North and had a very successful 12-year run as head coach at Lake Catholic in Mentor.

In 12 seasons at Lake Catholic, the Cougars won 6 NCL Championships, qualified for the state playoffs 8 times (playoff record of 17-8) with 5 Regional Title appearances (2003, 2006, 2007, 2009, 2010) and 3 state semifinal appearances (2007, 2009, and 2010).

Prior to 2002, Bell served as the Cougars' defensive coordinator for three seasons, winning the Division III State Championship in 2001.

Prior to coaching at Lake Catholic, Bell spent three years at Willoughby South as a position coach and defensive coordinator, four years at Maple Heights, and two seasons at his alma mater Pymatuning Valley.

GRIDIRON CLUB

Twinsburg coach Mike Bell has always been a strong believer in building a program and not just simply a football team that competes on Friday night.

Part of that is the involvement of those outside of the players and coaches, including the administration, the community and perhaps most importantly, the football parents.

Bell said the Tigers are extremely lucky to have the support of The Gridiron Club at Twinsburg and he doesn't take it for granted.

"It starts with our administration doing a great job getting our young men the equipment and necessities for the game, but when you think about all the extras to make us a first-class program that is where the Gridiron Club comes in and really help us," Bell said.

"There are a million ways for parents to get involved and I always encourage parents to get involved and do what they can because it doesn't last forever at the high school level obviously. The years go fast."

The Gridiron Club is an organization of football parents in grades 7 through 12. There is no fee to join and all members of the community are welcome to attend meetings. The Club meets the second Monday of the month at Twinsburg High School. Meetings begin at 6:00 p.m. All of the fundraising is run through Twinsburg Athletic Boosters.

The Gridiron Club raises funds to help support the team off the turf. From purchasing a new sound system for the locker room to feeding the boys on Friday nights and scrimmages, purchasing football gear such as t-shirts and cinch bags, senior gifts and hosting the end of year banquet. These events are important in developing a sense of unity and pride in the program.

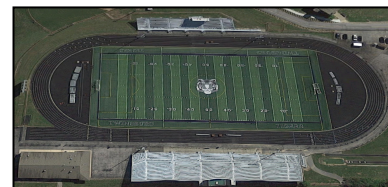

Twinsburg Tiger Stadium is one of the most used athletic facilities in Northeast Ohio. Twinsburg officials say Tiger Stadium's field gets used upwards of 950 times each year for various athletic events and practices -- from football, to soccer, to Relay For Life, to regional sporting events.

In the summer of 2015, the Stadium received a major upgrade to the playing surface. New field turf was installed featuring a unique blue border and a large Tiger logo at midfield. The 'grass' has a "paneled" look of lighter and darker green shades every five yards replacing a carpet that was installed in 2005.

Tiger Stadium has become a perennial site for OHSAA football playoff games, hosting two games last year - the Division I Region 1 Semifinal (St Edward vs Stow) and the Division II Region 5 Final (Hudson and Warren Harding)

1ST AND TEN WITH ANTHONY BYRD

Byrd is the Offensive Line Coach at Twinsburg

1. What is your football background?

A. This is my 15th year of coaching football. I played football in high school at Bedford High School for then Head Coach Jim Hodakievic. I was a three year varsity starter. Upon graduation from high school I earned a football scholarship to the University of Louisville. I was redshirted my first year (practicing every week, not playing in any games). I was a 4 year starter on the offensive line, my first year of playing was at guard and my last 3 years were at left tackle. Upon graduation from the University of Louisville I was an undrafted free agent for the New York Jets. I played professionally for two and a half years with New York Jets, Chicago Enforcers(XFL), Cincinnati Bengals, Amsterdam Admirals(NFL Europe). I retired from professional football after a back injury.

2. How would you describe your coaching style?

A. I would describe my coaching style as one that is demanding and constant teaching. As a player I have had the pleasure to be taught by some great coaches from high school to the NFL that not only taught the x's and o's of the game but the technical aspects of the game for offensive linemen. So as I have become a coach I teach our next generation of offensive linemen the techniques that I learned at the various levels I played at so they can be successful. I teach my linemen the tools to be successful and demand that they come to practice to compete and use those techniques that they have been taught.

3. Why do you think the team has been so successful early on vs. opponents that last year they struggled against?

A. Although this is my first year with this staff I think the reason we have been so successful is because the young men have bought in to what we as a staff have been teaching and they have had some success. Every week we as a staff raise the bar of our expectations on these young men. These young men then accept these new expectations and work throughout the week to meet them. We teach these young men that they should strive for perfection in all that they do. "If you are going to put in all this time and effort at whatever it is your doing why not be the best at it".

4. What attracted you to want to join Coach Bell's staff?

A. I have known Coach Bell for some time from our epic battles on the gridiron, Coach at Lake Catholic and myself at NDCL. My wife gave birth to twin boys in late spring and I was looking to possibly coach some place close to home. I work for the district and in talking with Coach Bell about an opportunity to join staff he had a position available. I've always enjoyed the challenge of preparing my offensive and defensive linemen at NDCL for Coach Bell's Lake Catholic teams. I always knew that Coach Bell's team were going to be disciplined, well coached, and play hard from the first snap to the last. So when Coach Bell offered the position to me I couldn't wait to get to work to see how successful we could be.

THIS DATE IN HISTORY

September 15, 1968 – WUAB Channel 43 in Cleveland broadcasted for the first time, and over the years became a leading station to carry professional sports in the Cleveland area.

In 1979, the station won the broadcast rights to the Cleveland Indians. WUAB would be the broadcast home of the Indians for 22 years (1980 through 2001). Perhaps the station's most famous Indians telecast was that of Len Barker's perfect game on May 15, 1981.

WUAB has been the longtime "free TV" home of the Cleveland Cavaliers, which first aired on the station from October 1980 to April 1988, and again since October 1994. Under the current deal with Fox Sports Ohio, Channel 43 simulcasts five Cavaliers regular season games, as well as select playoff games per year with the regional sports network, which serves as the Cavs' main television partner.

Channel 43 at various points throughout the years also carried Cleveland Barons, Cleveland Crusaders and Cleveland Lumberjacks hockey, Cleveland Gladiators arena football, and Cleveland Force indoor soccer games.
