## THE OPENING DRIVE

Twinsburg will play just its second home game of the season when the Tigers host North Royalton in a rare Saturday night game at Tiger Stadium.

Twinsburg started the season with three of its first four games on the road and the Tigers won all three away from home to begin with a 3-1 record.

After starting 2-0, North Royalton has lost two straight lopsided games to Medina Highland and Stow. Inland All-District honoree and senior running back Zach Antonio is back for the Bears joining sophomore quarterback Joey Marousek in the backfield. North Royalton's last playoff appearance was in 2012.

Twinsburg has an array of talented playmakers on both sides of the ball. Offensively, Seth Grabowski and Adam Van der Motter platoon at quarterback. Cam'Ron McClain is having a big season at running back and Christian Edgerson and Tre Radford are dangerous weapons in the passing game.

Defensviely, James Grammens, Isaiah Savitt, Joe Bell and Rashad Land-Jones are among several impact players for Coach Mike Bell.

Going back to the end of 2016, Twinsburg has won six of its last seven games with the lone loss coming in a tight setback to Division I power Solon this year.

Twinsburg used a dominating rushing attack and a stingy defense to defeat Cuyahoga Falls, 28-14, on Sept. 15.

It was the Tigers' third consecutive road win to start the season as they improved to 3-1 overall.

Cam'Ron McClain rushed for 122 yards and three touchdowns for Twinsburg.

Isaiah Savitt ran for the other score for the Tigers and had an interception on defense.

Twinsburg outgained Cuyahoga Falls, 316-146, and held a commanding 28-6 lead in the fourth quarter before a late score from the Black Tigers.

The Tigers rushed for 234 yards, keeping the ball on the ground for most of the night, while only throwing for 82 yards.

Twinsburg now has a two-game homestand to close out the month of September as the Tigers will host North Royalton (2-2) and Brecksville-Broadview Heights on Sept. 23 and Sept. 28, respectively.

## Alumni Travis Tarnowski Lands Week 3 GLIAC

Offensive Award
A record-setting and record-tying day has resulted in a conference honor for Ashland University redshirt senior quarterback Travis Tarnowski.

On Monday (Sept. 18) morning, Tarnowski was named the Week 3 Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Week. In the Eagles' 42-14 win on Saturday (Sept. 16) afternoon at Northwood, Tarnowski, in just one half of action, was 15-of-18 for 339 yards and five touchdowns.

Tarnowski became Ashland football's all-time leader in passing yards with 9,196 , and tied the program record for touchdown passes in a game, which he previously had done twice.
Through three weeks of the 2017 season, Tarnowski leads the GLIAC in passing yards (919) and passing touchdowns (10), and is third in the conference in completion percentage (70.2).
He has a current streak of 109 consecutive passes without an interception.
This is Tarnowski's second GLIAC Offensive Player of the Week award, his first coming on Oct. 19, 2015.

Stow rolls to 49-21 victory over North Royalton
Cory Rice threw for 213 yards and five touchdowns, three to Tyler Shaver, to lead the host Bulldogs (4-0, 1-0) to a National Division win over the Bears ( $2-2,0-1$ ).

Bryce Sheppert and Brian Cartwright also caught touchdown passes, Eric Schilling had a 60 -yard touchdown run and the Bulldogs amassed 553 total yards on offense.

## HEAD COACH MIKE BELL

HIRED FEBRUARY 4, 2015
Mike Bell is in his third year as coach of the Tigers and is looking to build on his past successes, bringing winning football back to Twinsburg.

Prior to coming to Twinsburg, Bell served one year as the head coach at Eastlake North and had a very successful 12-year run as head coach at Lake Catholic in Mentor.

In 12 seasons at Lake Catholic, the Cougars won 6
 NCL Championships, qualified for the state playoffs 8 times (playoff record of 17-8) with 5 Regional Title appearances (2003, 2006, 2007, 2009, 2010) and 3 state semifinal appearances (2007, 2009, and 2010).

Prior to 2002, Bell served as the Cougars' defensive coordinator for three seasons, winning the Division III State Championship in 2001.

Prior to coaching at Lake Catholic, Bell spent three years at Willoughby South as a position coach and defensive coordinator, four years at Maple Heights, and two seasons at his alma mater Pymatuning Valley.

## GRIDIRON CLUB

Twinsburg coach Mike Bell has always been a strong believer in building a program and not just simply a football team that competes on Friday night.

Part of that is the involvement of those outside of the players and coaches, including the administration, the community and perhaps most importantly, the football parents. Bell said the Tigers are extremely lucky to have the support of The Gridiron Club at Twinsburg and he doesn't take it for granted.
"It starts with our administration doing a great job getting our young men the equipment and necessities for the game, but when you think about all the extras to make us a first-class program that is where the Gridiron Club comes in and really help us," Bell said.
"There are a million ways for parents to get involved and I always encourage parents to get involved and do what they can because it doesn't last forever at the high school level obviously. The years go fast."

The Gridiron Club is an organization of football parents in grades 7 through 12. There is no fee to join and all members of the community are welcome to attend meetings. The Club meets the second Monday of the month at Twinsburg High School. Meetings begin at 6:00 p.m. All of the fundraising is run through Twinsburg Athletic Boosters.

From purchasing a new sound system for the locker room to feeding the boys on Friday nights and scrimmages, purchasing football gear such as t-shirts and cinch bags, senior gifts and hosting the end of year banquet. ## 1ST AND TEN WITH ERIN BENSON

BENSON IS THE TWINSBURG ATHLETIC OFFICE ADMINISTRATIVE ASSISTANT
1 - What is your background and how did you get involved with the Athletic Department at Twinsburg?
A - I'm a graduate of Indiana University of Pennsylvania with a Bachelor's Degree in Sports Administration and a minor in Business Administration. I formerly worked as a Director with the YMCA of Greater Cleveland and assisted my brother-in-law with opening his baseball academy in PA. My family moved to Twinsburg in January of 2015 while I was staying at home with my two children. My son was going to begin kindergarten in the Fall so I began looking to re-enter the workforce and it just so happened to be perfect timing with the opening for this position for which I was lucky enough to be selected for.

2 - What is a typical day in the office like for you? With so many athletic programs at the school it must be hectic, but satisfying to know you make such an important impact daily?

A - I think it is safe to say there is no such thing as at "typical" day in the athletic office. You never know what each minute will bring, but I can honestly say that is what I love most about my job! There is zero down time and it constantly involves multitasking. Daily I work on scheduling, transportation, financials, collection/documentation of all our athletes' paperwork, website maintenance, etc. but then get the welcoming break of students coming in to pay their athletic/club fees or assisting one of our coaches with a task. It is a very satisfying and rewarding job and I feel blessed to be in this role.

3 - What is your favorite part about Friday night football games?
A - I've always loved Friday night football games growing up and love even more that part of my job involves working hands-on with them here in Twinsburg! I enjoy getting to interact directly with the students, parents and community thru selling pre-sale tickets during lunch blocks on Friday at THS and working the pass gate at the game. There is nothing like the buzz and excitement of Friday night lights! I also adore witnessing the excitement of my 8 yr old son Braylon as game day approaches. He LOVES having the opportunity of being on the sideline with the team and being one of the ball boys.

4 - The team has steadily improved since Coach Bell's arrival. What do you think he brings to the program and how has he been to work with (he speaks very highly of you)?

A - Coach Bell has been awesome to work with and I honestly could not even being to list all the great things I feel he has done for our football program. Everyone can see the obvious improvements with our team on the field, but I would like to point out what I witness off the field here at THS.

He instills values in each of his players to make them polite, respectful young men who lead by example. There is a program we work together on where members of the team visit classrooms at Wilcox during their spirit week in the winter and read to the students. The feedback I receive from the staff, parents and students is astonishing. It has been so successful that I have been asked this year to bring the program over to Bissell as well. It is heartwarming to see a coach care just as much if not more about building the character of a young man as he does making him a successful football player.

[^0]:    Twinsburg Tiger Stadium is one of the most used athletic facilities in Northeast Ohio. Twinsburg officials say Tiger Stadium's field gets used upwards of 950 times each year for various athletic events and practices -- from football, to soccer, to Relay For Life, to regional sporting events.

    In the summer of 2015, the Stadium received a major upgrade to the playing surface. New field turf was installed featuring a unique blue border and a large Tiger logo at midfield. The 'grass' has a "paneled" look of lighter and darker green shades every five yards replacing a the carpet that was installed in 2005.

    Tiger Stadium has become a perennial site for OHSAA football playoff games, hosting two games last year - the Division I Region 1 Semifinal (St Edward vs Stow) and the Division II Region 5 Final (Hudson and Warren Harding)
    

[^1]:    September 23, 1845 The formal baseball team, the New York Knickerbockers organizes and adopts rules for both club operations and player conduct. The Knickerbockers Baseball Club would have a President and manager, plus other positions considered part of the 'Front Office' of a team today.

    The Knickerbockers, led by Alexander Cartwright, also established 'rules' for the games or matches the club was to be involved in...including three strikes was an out, a caught fair ball was also an out. Also including in the playing rules were three outs constituted an inning; players must bat in an agreed upon order; and the umpire had the final say on all judgement calls during the game.

    What was long considered the first "officially recorded" baseball game between two different teams was played on June 19, 1846 at the Elysian Fields in Hoboken, New Jersey. The two teams, the Knickerbockers and the New York Nine played the game using Cartwright's twenty rules. Cartwright and the Knickerbockers, lost 23 to 1 in four innings.
