THE OPENING DRIVE

Twinsburg will look to rebound from a tough Week 5 loss to North Royalton in a Week 6 matchup on Sept. 28 at home vs. Brecksville-Broadview Heights.

Brecksville-Broadview Heights notched its first Suburban League National Division Conference win of the year with a convincing 37-7 victory over conference rival Cuyahoga Falls in Week 5.

The Bees (3-2) were led by the efforts of quarterback Joe Labas, who threw three touchdowns. Labas' first touchdown pass was a 32-yard strike to wideout Joe Wiglusz in the first quarter. He then hit Jordan Shaheen for a 19-yard touchdown in the second quarter. Labas then found Shaheen again in the third quarter for a 54-yard score.

Twinsburg (3-2) is led offensively by dual quarterbacks Seth Grabowski and Adam Van der Motter. Running back Cam'Ron McClain has been a steady force in the rush attack. Christian Edgersen and Tre Radford are dangerous weapons on the outside.

Defensively, linebacker James Grammens is one of the top players in the league and Isaiah Savitt continues to be a huge impact player on special teams and defense for the Tigers. Both teams are vying for a spot in the Division II, Region 5 playoffs so the stakes are extremely high in this league tilt.

"I've always been impressed with how hard the Bees play. Every guy on the roster plays with a motor and plays with great discipline. We must be willing to hold ourselves, and one another accountable to the goals of this program. If we begin to do this we will become the team we are capable of becoming."

TIGERS RECAP

TOUGH LOSS PUTS TIGERS AT .500 IN SUBURBAN LEAGUE

North Royalton Bears 41

Twinsburg TIGERS 28

Twinsburg suffered a difficult loss at home to North Royalton on Sept. 23, as the Bears rallied for a 41-28 win.

Cam'Ron McClain ran for a 15-yard TD and Christian Edgerson caught a 76-yard touchdown pass from Adam Van der Motter to stake the Tigers (3-2) to an early 14-0 lead.

However, North Royalton tied the game at 14 prior to halftime.

The Bears scored three touchdowns in the third quarter surrounded by a kickoff return for a TD by Isaiah Savitt and another scoring run by McClain to take a 35-28 lead into the fourth quarter.

North Royalton put the game away with a touchdown run by Jake Franczak in the fourth quarter for a 13-point advantage.

Twinsburg was hurt by four turnovers and the Bear almost doubled the total plays from scrimmage for the Tigers at 89-49.

McClain ended up with 97 yards on the ground and two TDs for Twinsburg. Edgerson had 101 yards receiving and a touchdown for the Tigers.

The Bears improved to 3-2 and snapped a two-game losing skid.

BEES NEW HEAD COACH

BLACK RESIGNS, SIMONETTI HIRED

In January, Brecksville-Broadview Heights High School announced the resignation of head football coach Jason Black, effective immediately.

Black led the Bees football program for 8 years, compiling a career record 53-32.

His teams qualified for the OHSAA playoffs 4 times.

Athletic Director Mark Maslona said, "We are so very thankful to Jason for his countless contributions to our football program."

Jason Simonetti, previously an assistant coach with the Bees, was named the new head football coach.

Simonetti was an assistant coach at BBHHS for 7 years and he previously served as head coach of the Cuyahoga County West All-Star Team and the defensive coordinator in Parma City Schools and Buckeye Local Schools.

He is a business education teacher at BBHHS. Simonetti has been married to Hind for 14 years, and they have two children, Kaylee, 10, and Andrew, 8

HEAD COACH MIKE BELL

Hired February 4, 2015

Mike Bell is in his third year as coach of the Tigers and is looking to build on his past successes, bringing winning football back to Twinsburg.

Prior to coming to Twinsburg, Bell served one year as the head coach at Eastlake North and had a very successful 12-year run as head coach at Lake Catholic in Mentor.

In 12 seasons at Lake Catholic, the Cougars won 6 NCL Championships, qualified for the state playoffs 8 times (playoff record of 17-8) with 5 Regional Title appearances (2003, 2006, 2007, 2009, 2010) and 3 state semifinal appearances (2007, 2009, and 2010).

Prior to 2002, Bell served as the Cougars' defensive coordinator for three seasons, winning the Division III State Championship in 2001.

Prior to coaching at Lake Catholic, Bell spent three years at Willoughby South as a position coach and defensive coordinator, four years at Maple Heights, and two seasons at his alma mater Pymatuning Valley.

GRIDIRON CLUB

Twinsburg coach Mike Bell has always been a strong believer in building a program and not just simply a football team that competes on Friday night.

Part of that is the involvement of those outside of the players and coaches, including the administration, the community and perhaps most importantly, the football parents.

Bell said the Tigers are extremely lucky to have the support of The Gridiron Club at Twinsburg and he doesn't take it for granted.

"It starts with our administration doing a great job getting our young men the equipment and necessities for the game, but when you think about all the extras to make us a first-class program that is where the Gridiron Club comes in and really help us," Bell said.

"There are a million ways for parents to get involved and I always encourage parents to get involved and do what they can because it doesn't last forever at the high school level obviously. The years go fast."

The Gridiron Club is an organization of football parents in grades 7 through 12. There is no fee to join and all members of the community are welcome to attend meetings. The Club meets the second Monday of the month at Twinsburg High School. Meetings begin at 6:00 p.m. All of the fundraising is run through Twinsburg Athletic Boosters.

The Gridiron Club raises funds to help support the team off the turf. From purchasing a new sound system for the locker room to feeding the boys on Friday nights and scrimmages, purchasing football gear such as t-shirts and cinch bags, senior gifts and hosting the end of year banquet. These events are important in developing a sense of unity and pride in the program.

Twinsburg Tiger Stadium is one of the most used athletic facilities in Northeast Ohio. Twinsburg officials say Tiger Stadium's field gets used upwards of 950 times each year for various athletic events and practices -- from football, to soccer, to Relay For Life, to regional sporting events.

In the summer of 2015, the Stadium received a major upgrade to the playing surface. New field turf was installed featuring a unique blue border and a large Tiger logo at midfield. The 'grass' has a "paneled" look of lighter and darker green shades every five yards replacing a carpet that was installed in 2005.

Tiger Stadium has become a perennial site for OHSAA football playoff games, hosting two games last year - the Division I Region 1 Semifinal (St Edward vs Stow) and the Division II Region 5 Final (Hudson and Warren Harding)

THIS DATE IN HISTORY

September 28, 1920 — Shoeless Joe Jackson and seven of his teammates on the 1919 Chicago White Sox were indicted by a grand jury for allegedly throwing the World Series to the Cincinnati Reds

September 28, 1941 — Ted Williams of the Boston Red Sox recorded six hits in eight at-bats in a doubleheader at Shibe Park against the Philadelphia Athletics to finish the season with a batting average of .406. Through 2012, no major league player has hit .400 since Williams

September 28, 1986 - Cleveland Browns wide receiver and punt returner Gerald 'The Ice Cube' McNeil sets a Browns franchise record for the longest punt return with an 84-yard run (and TD) against the Lions. The Browns win the home game 24-21, and go on to win the 1986 AFC Central Division Championship
