THE OPENING DRIVE

Twinsburg is in the midst of a difficult stretch of games and is battling a three-game losing streak. It won't get any easier on Oct. 13 as the Tigers travel to undefeated Wadsworth.

Through the first six weeks of the high school football season, few have been able to contain Wadsworth's high-octane offense, in particular senior quarterback Joey Baughman.

In Week 7, Baughman threw for a school-record 416 yards and three touchdowns to lead the Grizzlies over host North Royalton, 61-28, in Suburban League National Division action. Baughman completed 21 of 32 passes. He added 74 yards on the ground and two more scores, totaling 490 yards of offense on the night. He led the Grizzlies to eight consecutive scoring drives and 595 yards of offense.

Baughman connected with three different targets on his touchdown passes: senior wide receiver Christian Szalay for a 49-yard score; junior running back Brock Snowball from 14 yards out; and senior wide receiver Mitchell Blackburn for a 74-yard strike on the Grizzlies' third play of the second half. He added touchdown runs of 10 and 11 yards.

Wadsworth (7-0, 4-0) has now scored 364 points through seven games -- an average of 52 points per game. Baughman has accounted for 2,536 total yards - 1,864 passing, 672 rushing - and 31 touchdowns.

Twinsburg comes into the contest having allowed 132 points during a three-game skid to very proficient offenses, so defensively the Tigers will need to step up against Baughman and company.

James Grammens (62 tackles, 10 TFL) is an all-conference linebacker and usually sets the tone for Twinsburg on defense. Isaiah Savitt, Rashad Land-Jones and James Bessett are among a handful of others that will need to be impact players to slow down the Grizzlies.

Offensively, Seth Grabowski and Adam Van der Motter have platooned at quarterback with Grabowski throwing for all the team's yards in a recent loss to Stow. Cami Ron McClain continues to be a workhorse at running back with 767 yards and 8 touchdowns on 151 carries this season.

Christian Edgersen leads the team in receiving with 25 catches for 571 yards and Tre Radford is just behind with 21 catches for 326 yards.

High-scoring Game Has Tigers On Short End

Twinsburg TIGERS **38**

Twinsburg scored first in a road showdown at Stow on Oct. 6, but the Bulldogs rolled past the Tigers, 56-38.

Total yards and first downs were almost identical, but after an early field goal by Brandon Callow gave Twinsburg (3-4) a quick 3-0 advantage, Stow scored 42 of the next 49 points to take a commanding 32-point lead into halftime.

Seth Grabowski threw for 107 yards and two touchdowns – one to Christian Edgeron and one to Isaiah Savitt. Khadafhi Taylor ran for 46 yards and a score and Savitt added another TD on the ground for the Tigers.

Three turnovers hurt Twinsburg as the Bulldogs powerful offense led by QB Coryon Rice scored 28 points in the second quarter to turn it into a running clock situation to start the third.

Cam'Ron McClain led the rushing attack for the Tigers with 89 yards. Callow went 5 for 5 on extra points for Twinsburg.

HEAD COACH MIKE BELL

Hired February 4, 2015

Mike Bell is in his third year as coach of the Tigers and is looking to build on his past successes, bringing winning football back to Twinsburg.

Prior to coming to Twinsburg, Bell served one year as the head coach at Eastlake North and had a very successful 12-year run as head coach at Lake Catholic in Mentor.

In 12 seasons at Lake Catholic, the Cougars won 6 NCL Championships, qualified for the state playoffs 8 times (playoff record of 17-8) with 5 Regional Title appearances (2003, 2006, 2007, 2009, 2010) and 3 state semifinal appearances (2007, 2009, and 2010).

Prior to 2002, Bell served as the Cougars' defensive coordinator for three seasons, winning the Division III State Championship in 2001.

Prior to coaching at Lake Catholic, Bell spent three years at Willoughby South as a position coach and defensive coordinator, four years at Maple Heights, and two seasons at his alma mater Pymatuning Valley.

GRIDIRON CLUB

Twinsburg coach Mike Bell has always been a strong believer in building a program and not just simply a football team that competes on Friday night.

Part of that is the involvement of those outside of the players and coaches, including the administration, the community and perhaps most importantly, the football parents.

Bell said the Tigers are extremely lucky to have the support of The Gridiron Club at Twinsburg and he doesn't take it for granted.

"It starts with our administration doing a great job getting our young men the equipment and necessities for the game, but when you think about all the extras to make us a first-class program that is where the Gridiron Club comes in and really help us," Bell said.

"There are a million ways for parents to get involved and I always encourage parents to get involved and do what they can because it doesn't last forever at the high school level obviously. The years go fast."

The Gridiron Club is an organization of football parents in grades 7 through 12. There is no fee to join and all members of the community are welcome to attend meetings. The Club meets the second Monday of the month at Twinsburg High School. Meetings begin at 6:00 p.m. All of the fundraising is run through Twinsburg Athletic Boosters.

The Gridiron Club raises funds to help support the team off the turf. From purchasing a new sound system for the locker room to feeding the boys on Friday nights and scrimmages, purchasing football gear such as t-shirts and cinch bags, senior gifts and hosting the end of year banquet. These events are important in developing a sense of unity and pride in the program.

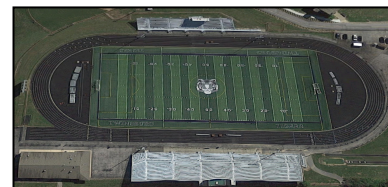

Twinsburg Tiger Stadium is one of the most used athletic facilities in Northeast Ohio. Twinsburg officials say Tiger Stadium's field gets used upwards of 950 times each year for various athletic events and practices -- from football, to soccer, to Relay For Life, to regional sporting events.

In the summer of 2015, the Stadium received a major upgrade to the playing surface. New field turf was installed featuring a unique blue border and a large Tiger logo at midfield. The 'grass' has a "paneled" look of lighter and darker green shades every five yards replacing a carpet that was installed in 2005.

Tiger Stadium has become a perennial site for OHSAA football playoff games, hosting two games last year - the Division I Region 1 Semifinal (St Edward vs Stow) and the Division II Region 5 Final (Hudson and Warren Harding)

Heman is the Janitor at R.B. Chamberlin Middle School

1 - How long have you been in your current position and what is your background?

A - I have worked at R.B. Chamberlin Middle School going on 3 years.

2 - What are the major differences in your responsibilities between 2-a-days in the summer, practices and game days?

A - Cleaning the Field Houses, Press Box and lavatories at the stadium.

3 - How close do you eventually get with the student athletes and the coaching staff with your position and is it then easier to be a fan on Friday nights because of the relationship?

A - I have built strong relationships with student athletes from their 7 & 8 grade years and then following them through high school. Colin Bowser is a great example. So absolutely the coaches, students, band and athletic boosters and their children have my full support. I feel the adults / coaches / teachers do a great job building the character of the students and in the end this is far more important than the score at the end of the game.

4 - Facilities are such a big thing in high school football because obviously not all stadiums and schools are equal. Do you take a certain sense of pride in the fact that Twinsburg is regarded as one of the area's top facilities and is always a popular candidate for playoff games?

A - Obviously as I've been told the facility is cleaner than it's ever been and I'm the one cleaning it there is a strong sense of pride not only in myself but in the community the stadium represents.

THIS DATE IN HISTORY

October 13, 1920 - The City of Cleveland celebrates the Cleveland Indians first World Series championship with a celebration in Wade Park that sees more than 50,000 people attend.

The day before the Indians had defeated the Brooklyn Robins (soon to be the Dodgers) 5 games to 2 to win the best of nine World Series.

The Indians won four straight games to close out the series, all played at League Park in Cleveland. Stan Coveleski won three games in the series and had 0.67 ERA.

Elmer Smith lead the team in hitting in the Series and the season. He had a home run and 5 RBI in the seven games; for the year he led the team with 12 home runs. Tris Speaker hit .320 in the World Series.
