THE OPENING DRIVE

A pair of 1-1 teams and neighborhood rivals face off in a critical Week 3 matchup as Aurora travels to Twinsburg.

The Greenmen - who rallied for their first win of the year last week - graduated their offensive line from last season and bring back just three starters on defense. They have made the playoffs 13 straight years.

QB Colin McNamara can push the offense with his arm or his feet, which should help a defense led by last year's top tackler in middle linebacker Jack Arnold. The combination should help Coach Bob Mihalik, who is just three wins shy of 150 for his career, reach that milestone.

The Tigers are coming off a tough loss at Solon in which the offense was shut down in the shutout. QB Adam Van De Motter and company will look to bounce back.

James Besett, Jamir James and Aiden Malenchek are all talented two-way players for the Tigers.

Both Twinsburg and Aurora were shut out by Solon.

"Aurora looks solid on film. They play hard and execute well. They play a very aggressive style on defense and try to out physical you on offense. The QB is a competitor and he has some weapons surrounding him. We must develop focus and a heightened sense of urgency in our preparation. This is a big week for us and our thoughts and execution must be clear and precise.

In Week 2, Twinsburg found out exactly why there is so much buzz surrounding the Solon defense this fall.

The Tigers were held to 37 total yards of offense as the Comets recorded a second straight shutout, defeating Twinsburg, 38-0 at Stewart Field.

Solon shut out Aurora, 25-0, in Week 1. The Greenmen and the Tigers meet in Week 3.

Khalil Eichelberger scored three rushing TDs in the first half for the Comets and Pat McQuaide had a pair of touchdown passes as Solon built a 32-0 lead at the break.

The running clock was enacted for the second half.

Twinsburg managed just 35 yards passing and 2 yards rushing.

GREENMAN GET A WIN

AURORA: It was a plan that failed miserably. Fortunately for the Aurora football team, the end result could not have been more beautiful.

The host Greenmen earned a thrilling come-from-behind 29-28 victory over Cuyahoga Valley Christian Academy last week at Veterans Stadium.

After a 46-yard touchdown run by senior fullback Jack Arnold, it appeared as if Aurora's chances of getting its first victory of 2018 was going to slip through its fingertips. Actually, it did — literally. Trailing 28-27 with 8:30 to go, senior Colin McNamara bobbled the snap on the point-after try.

But the mishandled snap turned out to be the best thing that could have happened to the Greenmen (1-1).

That's because McNamara calmly picked up the ball, took a step and then found senior tight end Alec Houston in the end zone.

As a result, a potential disaster turned out to be a crucial 2-point conversion. And that conversion gave Aurora the improbable win.

The Greenmen had trouble containing CVCA's dazzling trio of playmakers in senior wide receiver/running back Tre Tucker, senior running back Jacob Decatur and sophomore quarterback Michael Bevington.

Tucker is the reigning 100-meter track champion and Decatur is a state wrestling champion.

But Aurora found a way to neutralize the Royals' high-powered attack when it mattered.

Arnold finished with just four carries for 58 yards. One of those rushing attempts might have been the most important play of the game.

Tucker, who lined up out of the wildcat formation several times, finished with 123 yards on 14 carries. He had touchdown runs of 6, 26 and 11, respectively. Decatur finished with 150 yards on 31 attempts. Bevington added a 13-yard scoring run.

Aurora also got touchdown runs from senior tailback Kobe Coachman (5 yards), McNamara (8) and Jordan DeMicco (4). Junior tailback James Austin ran for 66 yards in 15 attempts and McNamara had 79 yards rushing on 12 carries.

HEAD COACH MIKE BELL

HIRED FEBRUARY 4, 2015

Mike Bell is in his fourth year as coach of the Tigers and is looking to build on his past successes, bringing winning football back to Twinsburg.

Prior to coming to Twinsburg, Bell served one year as the head coach at Eastlake North and had a very successful 12-year run as head coach at Lake Catholic in Mentor.

In 12 seasons at Lake Catholic, the Cougars won 6 NCL Championships, qualified for the state playoffs 8 times (playoff record of 17-8) with 5 Regional Title appearances (2003, 2006, 2007, 2009, 2010) and 3 state semifinal appearances (2007, 2009, and 2010).

Prior to 2002, Bell served as the Cougars' defensive coordinator for three seasons, winning the Division III State Championship in 2001.

Prior to coaching at Lake Catholic, Bell spent three years at Willoughby South as a position coach and defensive coordinator, four years at Maple Heights, and two seasons at his alma mater Pymatuning Valley.

GRIDIRON CLUB

Twinsburg coach Mike Bell has always been a strong believer in building a program and not just simply a football team that competes on Friday night.

Part of that is the involvement of those outside of the players and coaches, including the administration, the community and perhaps most importantly, the football parents.

Bell said the Tigers are extremely lucky to have the support of The Gridiron Club at Twinsburg and he doesn't take it for granted.

"It starts with our administration doing a great job getting our young men the equipment and necessities for the game, but when you think about all the extras to make us a first-class program that is where the Gridiron Club comes in and really helps us," Bell said.

"There are a million ways for parents to get involved and I always encourage parents to get involved and do what they can because it doesn't last forever at the high school level obviously. The years go fast."

The Gridiron Club is an organization of football parents in grades 7 through 12. There is no fee to join and all members of the community are welcome to attend meetings. The Club meets the second Monday of the month at Twinsburg High School. Meetings begin at 6:00 p.m. All of the fundraising is run through Twinsburg Athletic Boosters.

The Gridiron Club raises funds to help support the team off the turf. From purchasing a new sound system for the locker room to feeding the boys on Friday nights and scrimmages, purchasing football gear such as t-shirts and cinch bags, senior gifts and hosting the end of year banquet. These events are important in developing a sense of unity and pride in the program.

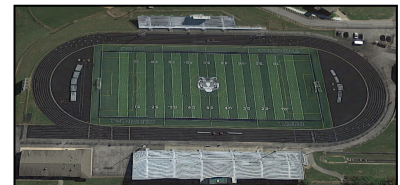

Twinsburg Tiger Stadium is one of the most used athletic facilities in Northeast Ohio. Twinsburg officials say Tiger Stadium's field gets used upwards of 950 times each year for various athletic events and practices -- from football, to soccer, to regional sporting events.

In the summer of 2015, the Stadium received a major upgrade to the playing surface. New field turf was installed featuring a unique blue border and a large Tiger logo at midfield. The 'grass' has a "paneled" look of lighter and darker green shades every five yards replacing a the carpet that was installed in 2005.

Tiger Stadium has become a perennial site for OHSAA football playoff games, hosting two games last year - the Division I Region 1 Semifinal (St Edward vs Stow) and the Division II Region 5 Final (Hudson and Warren Harding)

1ST AND 10 WITH CHRIS SHAFFER

SHAFFER IS THE VARSITY SECONDARY COACH & FRESHMAN HEAD COACH

1 - What is your football background and how did you get into coaching?

I have been coaching football for 15 years. I started as a youth coach and then got the opportunity to coach freshmen at THS. This is my 12th year with the Tigers!!

2 - What is your general philosophy coaching freshmen, is it more to prepare the players for the JV and varsity or trying to win games or balancing both?

I believe that my job is to prepare the young players to eventually be contributors at the varsity level. While we try to win every game it is equally important that every player understands the process of what that takes. I also try to instill a love of the game that will keep the young players involved and eager to improve!

3 - How involved if at all do you get in the community youth programs and middle schools since you are the first coach they will play for at the high school level?

I try to watch the middle school team at practice and in games. I like to learn the names and get a feel for the type of player a young man is.

4 - What is your favorite part about game day, whether that is for the freshman games or Friday nights?

At the freshman level I enjoy getting the players ready to take on a relatively unknown opponent. It is a challenge to figure out what will work that given game. There is nothing better than Friday Night Lights! The whole atmosphere is still amazing to me!

THIS DATE IN HISTORY

September 7, 1963 - The Professional Football Hall of Fame is dedicated in Canton, Ohio. The original 19,000 square-foot Hall of Fame museum has grown in size and stature over the 55 years of operations. Currently the Hall of Fame and the football complex surrounding the site have grown to more than 200,000 square feet and numerous youth athletic fields, plus a convention center and hotel.

September 7, 1979 - at 7:00 p.m. EST, an estimated 30,000 viewers tuned in to witness the launch of The Entertainment and Sports Programming Network...ESPN. The first score anchor George Grande announced was Chris Evert's victory over Billie Jean King at the US Open. Sports Center lasted a half-hour, consisting mainly of videotaped highlights and following its conclusion that night, the network aired a slow-pitch softball game
