## THE OPENING DRIVE

Two teams hungry for a win will face off on Sept. 14 when Cuyahoga Falls travels to Twinsburg. The Black Tigers are 0-3 and Coach Mike Bell's Tigers are on a two-game losing streak.

Cuyahoga Falls is led by QB Braunavan Arsenault. The Black Tigers pass the ball more than most of the teams Twinsburg has seen thus far this season. Robert Graves scored the team's lone touchdown in Week 3 vs. Barberton.

Cuyahoga Falls has lost 22 straight games. The Black Tigers haven't won since Week 1 in 2016.

The Tigers have struggled the past two weeks offensively after a huge performance in Week 1 vs. Copley. QB Adam Van de Motter continues to be a leader through the air and on the ground. James Besett and Jamir James remain top offensive threats for Twinsburg.

Defensively, Rashad Jones-Land and Aiden Malenchek are impact players for the Tigers who will be called upon to slow down Cuyahoga Falls' attack.

The teams played last year in Week 4 with Twinsburg winning, 28-14.

### **BELL RINGING - Tigers Head Coach Mike Bell discusses lat week's game and the upcoming week 4 game vs Cuyahoga Falls**

"Last week was an incredibly disappointing game for us. I believe we all expect more from ourselves than what we showed against a well-coached, tough team in Aurora. We must improve our execution and mental toughness if we plan to play to our potential."

"Cuyahoga Falls is a much different team than what we've been facing. They have relied primarily on the passing game on offense to move the ball and set up the run. The teams we've faced early this season have been the opposite of that. They are solid in the kicking game and play an even front on defense. This is a big return to fundamentals week for us. We must find a way to improve in our own execution so that we are able to play at the level I believe we are capable of playing."

The three letters "PCE" is a cultural blueprint that Twinsburg coach Mike Bell wants his program to follow each day.

Playing the game with passion, being a great teammate, doing everything with passion.

**C COMMITMENT**  
We talk about it being an all-the-time thing, not when it is comfortable or convenient. What kind of player do you want to be? What kind of impact do you want to have on the program?

**E EXECUTION**  
Everyone has dreams of being great, but to actually go out and make it happen through hard work is something we strive for. It has to do with effort.

"The nice thing is individually we control all of those things in PCE," Bell said.

Twinsburg lost for the second straight week and struggled offensively again as Aurora knocked off the Tigers, 21-7, on Sept. 7.

The Greenmen (2-1) got a pair of touchdown passes from QB Colin McNamara to take a 14-0 lead.

Twinsburg (1-2) cut the deficit in half on a 54-yard TD pass from Adam Van de Motter to James Besett in the second quarter, but those were the only points of the game for the Tigers.

Aurora added an insurance score in the second half while the defense limited Twinsburg to less than 200 total yards and under 4 yards per play from scrimmage.

Van de Motter threw for 68 yards and rushed for 61.

Coach Mike Bell called the loss "disappointing".

#### LAST TIME OUT FOR BLACK TIGERS:

September 7, 2018  
At Barberton

BARBERTON: It's an attack Barberton has used all season en route to a 3-0 record. The Magics employed blazing backfield production and stout defense to perfection on Friday night in a 55-6 demolition of visiting Cuyahoga Falls.

Barberton's offense got rolling on the third snap of the game when junior quarterback Chase Haywood found sophomore Kyrie Young for a 60-yard completion. Young punched it in from one yard out two plays later to give the Magics their first lead of the game.

The other half of Barberton's one-two backfield punch got in on the scoring on the next drive when junior Kenneth Hood dove in for another one-yard score. Young scored another on a 40-yard carry later in the half.

The Magics led 48-0 at the half.

The Black Tigers didn't gain a first down until their first drive in the second half.

Barberton held Cuyahoga Falls junior quarterback Braunavan Arsenaault to 1-for-9 passing in the first half for minus-1 yard and two interceptions — one which he returned for a touchdown.

The Black Tigers scored their only touchdown with about four minutes left in the third quarter on a 67-yard run by junior Robert Graves.

#### CLIFFORD STADIUM:

The Cuyahoga Falls Black Tigers have been playing football since 1911, and in 1924, the Black Tigers began the season in a stadium with seating for 300 people.

The Falls High School Football Stadium was again expanded in 1939, and lights were installed at the campus facility.

In 1940, the field was dedicated to school board president Earl Clifford, who was tragically killed earlier that year.

## HEAD COACH MIKE BELL

HIRED FEBRUARY 4, 2015

Mike Bell is in his fourth year as coach of the Tigers and is looking to build on his past successes, bringing winning football back to Twinsburg.

Prior to coming to Twinsburg, Bell served one year as the head coach at Eastlake North and had a very successful 12-year run as head coach at Lake Catholic in Mentor.

In 12 seasons at Lake Catholic, the Cougars won 6 NCL Championships, qualified for the state playoffs 8 times (playoff record of 17-8) with 5 Regional Title appearances (2003, 2006, 2007, 2009, 2010) and 3 state semifinal appearances (2007, 2009, and 2010).

Prior to 2002, Bell served as the Cougars' defensive coordinator for three seasons, winning the Division III State Championship in 2001.

Prior to coaching at Lake Catholic, Bell spent three years at Willoughby South as a position coach and defensive coordinator, four years at Maple Heights, and two seasons at his alma mater Pymatuning Valley.

## GRIDIRON CLUB

Twinsburg coach Mike Bell has always been a strong believer in building a program and not just simply a football team that competes on Friday night.

Part of that is the involvement of those outside of the players and coaches, including the administration, the community and perhaps most importantly, the football parents.

Bell said the Tigers are extremely lucky to have the support of The Gridiron Club at Twinsburg and he doesn't take it for granted.

"It starts with our administration doing a great job getting our young men the equipment and necessities for the game, but when you think about all the extras to make us a first-class program that is where the Gridiron Club comes in and really helps us," Bell said.

"There are a million ways for parents to get involved and I always encourage parents to get involved and do what they can because it doesn't last forever at the high school level obviously. The years go fast."

The Gridiron Club is an organization of football parents in grades 7 through 12. There is no fee to join and all members of the community are welcome to attend meetings. The Club meets the second Monday of the month at Twinsburg High School. Meetings begin at 6:00 p.m. All of the fundraising is run through Twinsburg Athletic Boosters.

The Gridiron Club raises funds to help support the team off the turf. From purchasing a new sound system for the locker room to feeding the boys on Friday nights and scrimmages, purchasing football gear such as t-shirts and cinch bags, senior gifts and hosting the end of year banquet. These events are important in developing a sense of unity and pride in the program.

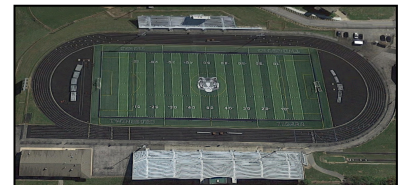

Twinsburg Tiger Stadium is one of the most used athletic facilities in Northeast Ohio. Twinsburg officials say Tiger Stadium's field gets used upwards of 950 times each year for various athletic events and practices -- from football, to soccer, to regional sporting events.

In the summer of 2015, the Stadium received a major upgrade to the playing surface. New field turf was installed featuring a unique blue border and a large Tiger logo at midfield. The 'grass' has a "paneled" look of lighter and darker green shades every five yards replacing the carpet that was installed in 2005.

Tiger Stadium has become a perennial site for OHSAA football playoff games, hosting two games last year - the Division I Region 1 Semifinal (St Edward vs Stow) and the Division II Region 5 Final (Hudson and Warren Harding)

## 1ST AND 10 WITH JOHN GARBER

GARBER IS THE HEAD COACH OF THE GIRLS VARSITY SOCCER TEAM

1 - What is your background and how did you get into coaching?

A - As a player, I was a four-year varsity letter winner in high school. I earned four varsity letter while attending John Carroll University, and had a short stint with Cleveland's minor league soccer team, AFC Cleveland. My first coaching position was serving as a graduate assistant at John Carroll University. I was the assistant women's soccer coach/goalkeeper coach. Following graduate school, I served as the Twinsburg Boys Varsity Assistant Coach for ten seasons, and since 2016, I have been the Twinsburg Girls Varsity Soccer Head Coach.

2 - What is your general philosophy and approach to coaching?

A - Broadly, my coaching philosophy is focused on the development of our student-athletes both academically and athletically. The vast majority of our student-athletes will not play their sport professionally. It is critical as coaches that we emphasize the importance of academics. With that said, our athletes must experience a demanding training environment, be receptive to coaching, unafraid to make mistakes, take risks on the field and to hold one another accountable. Above all though, the team concept is seminal. Each athlete regardless of status (captain, starter, all-conference, role player, JV or Varsity) is important to the overall success of a program.

3 - What are your goals/expectations for the 2018 season?

A - We hope to be competitive in our conference this season and compete for a Suburban League championship. Additionally, as a program, we want to compete for a District Championship.

4 - How important do you feel it is for athletic programs to support each other at the high school level?

A - It is very important for athletic programs to support each other. I am a big advocate of multi-sport athletes, a trend which is, unfortunately, declining at the high school level. Building a culture of academic and athletic excellence, much like coaching an individual sport, is a team goal. Student-athletes represent their communities, their schools, their coaches, their families and their peers. As such, it is important that teams frequently support fellow student-athletes and coaches who represent the same institutions and share similar goals.

## THIS DATE IN HISTORY

**September 14, 2003** - - Baltimore Ravens running back Jamal Lewis sets the NFL single-game rushing record when he runs for 295 yards and 2 touchdowns on 30 carries in the Ravens 33-13 victory over Cleveland at M&T Bank Stadium. Browns receiver Kevin Johnson scores the Browns only touchdown on a 4-yard TD pass from QB Kelly Holcolm.

**September 14, 1994** - - Amidst a work stoppage that began on August 12th, Major League Baseball team owners voted to cancel the remainder of the 1994 season. Despite the strike beginning a month prior, the season was not cancelled until mid-September. Instead of making up canceled games sometime in November and December, the season was dismissed and baseball became the first professional sport to lose its entire postseason due to a labor dispute.

At the time of the strike, the Cleveland Indians were 66-47 (2nd place in the new American League Central Division) and in line to make the post season for the first time in 40 years.
