We are happy to share details about our school, what to expect in kindergarten, how to help your child prepare for school, information about immunizations, ways parents can get involved, and next steps to enroll your child in the Twinsburg City School District.



Wilcox Primary School is home to over 700 children in grades preschool, kindergarten, and first grade. As part of a commitment to early childhood education, the TCSD has supported full day kindergarten for over 25 years. Typical class sizes in kindergarten include about 22-25 children with one teacher. The first days of school for all students will be August 14, 15, and 16. During these soft-reopening days students will come to school ONE of the first three days in smaller groups to meet their teacher and become familiar with their school. Welcome to Wilcox Primary School!

My name is Kara Miller and I have been teaching kindergarten at Wilcox for several years! Kindergarten is so special to me as the children are full of wonder and excitement for learning. I've been asked to share what a typical day may look like in kindergarten at Wilcox.

We begin our day with daily announcements. We recite our Wilcox Pledge. We promise to do our best work, be responsible, respectful, caring and safe. Then classroom teachers begin their morning meetings. We talk about the calendar, weather, count and practice our letters and sounds. We discuss which special class we will have. We rotate through art, gym and music and get to have tech time and library class once a week. We have lunch and recess at school. Students can buy a hot lunch or pack one from home. We also ask parents to send in a daily snack....






Hello! My name is Scott Astey, I am an assistant principal at Wilcox Primary School. When it comes to being READY for kindergarten, there are only two requirements. The first, you must be five years old on or before August 1, 2024. and second, you need live within the Twinsburg City School District. However, there are 5 key developmental areas that we look for when we say, children are ready for kindergarten. The first key developmental area is communication, this refers to a child's ability to both listen and say what they want and need with others. The second, is the Early Learning setting or how well the children are able to adjust to the structured, social school learning environment. Number 3 is a child's motor development this includes both gross motor, such as movement running jumping skipping, and fine motor, how well the child uses scissors, crayons and writing tools. Number 4 are the academics, here, we look at a child's ability to identify colors, shapes, letters, sounds and numbers. The fifth key developmental area is regarding a child's social ability which is how they interact with other children and teachers and how well they demonstrate their own independence .




Hi everyone and welcome to Wilcox! I'm Kara Morgart, the school counselor. I can't wait to get the chance to see your child in the school setting and to more importantly, get to know them! I'm looking forward to providing academic, mental, social, and emotional support to our students. I am always available to students just by them asking me. I am also available to you for any concerns, suggestions, or support through phone or email. The students will get to know me by me visiting their classrooms once a month for a guidance lesson. In addition, some will also see me during group time and individual time in my office. Here at Wilcox some of my main focuses include fostering independence, helping to make separation from parents and caregivers as seamless as possible and of course building confidence and understanding in each students academic, mental, social, and emotional learning and growing. Early Entrance

(packets available in the Wilcox office beginning April 2)




- August 2-December 31 birthday
- Whole grade acceleration
- Need to have superior cognitive ability (>115 IQ)
- Academic Achievement (math, language arts, science, vocabulary)
- Aptitude (compared to much older child)

Sometimes the parents of children whose birthdays do not meet the August 1 cut-off seek the opportunity for their child to participate in Early Entrance testing. Early Entrance to kindergarten is considered a whole grade acceleration, even if the child's birthday is only a few days after August 1st. To complete this process, parents should contact the Wilcox office to pick up an Early Entrance packet. After you complete the information and turn in your child's birth certificate and proof of residency, a school psychologist will contact you for your child's assessment. The first part of the assessment will be a cognitive (or IQ) assessment. Children who score 115 or above will be invited back for further academic and aptitude assessments. Parents should be aware that this is a rigorous process equivalent to skipping a grade, so few children meet all the necessary criteria. Here at Wilcox primary school, we have a newer preschool program called, the Kindergarten Preparatory Program, or the KPP. The KPP is an alternative opportunity to kindergarten designed for students who have summer birthdays, are young fives or do not make early entrance. Parents, if you're wondering if your child is ready for kindergarten and think they need another year before starting kindergarten, this program might be for you. The KPP is a half-day, pre-kindergarten, program that features project-based learning. Project Based learning, takes students interests and captivates the various learning domains based off their interests in themed projects. The program is designed for students age 4 by August 1st 2024 and not going to kindergarten. The tuition for this past year was \$2,100 for the year which is \$11.67 a day. Scholarships are available for those who may qualify for free or reduced lunch status. The KPP application window is opened but will closes this Friday, March 15th 2024. So if you are interested in the KPP program please visit the preschool web page or contact the school.




Hi, I am Jennifer Pinkney the District Nurse in Twinsburg, welcome to Wilcox! As a Kindergarten student there are 3 medical documents we will need prior to your child starting in August. First is their immunization records, please ask your family doctor to give you a copy of this or if you have MyChart for your child you may be able to print it off there. Next we will need a physical examination form as this is required by the state of Ohio, along with an oral exam that is required per the Twinsburg City School District. Both of these documents are good for 1 year from the date of the actual exams. These forms are available via the Twinsburg City School District website. Go to For Parents and click on Forms. Under Medical Forms are all the documents you may need for your child.

Does your child have any concerns regarding their health? Please let us know if we should be on the lookout for a student regarding their health from allergies, seizures, or to needing daily medication at school. Please know we can keep medications for students in the clinic with our Nurse who is in the building during school hours. All of these forms are available under the same Forms tab mention earlier.



There are many ways to get involved and stay connected through the PTA. The PTA stands strong with parent volunteers and support. With the help, support and involvement of PTA members Wilcox continues to strive in innovative ways to enrich our students.




At this point, you are probably ready to sign up your child for their kindergarten year at Wilcox! You might also have additional questions. The week of March 18 parents will be able to complete the initial enrollment application by going to our website, under FOR PARENTS > REGISTRATION AND ENROLLMENT NEW STUDENTS. This page has information about registration and the documents you will need to bring to your appointment the day your child participates in kindergarten screening.



This year, we will be conducting registration and screening appointments for NEW STUDENTS to Wilcox on June 3rd and 4th at Wilcox Primary School. If your child is currently attending Wilcox Preschool, you do not need to sign up for a screening time as they will be screened while they are at school. Each child must be accompanied by a parent or guardian who will drop them off with a Wilcox teacher and will pick them up in the same location after the screening is complete. While your child is with our teachers, parents and guardians will complete the enrollment process and meet with a school nurse. You should plan to be here about one hour.



As Mr. Astey mentioned, kindergarten screening will take place in June at Wilcox. Parents and children can expect to be at their registration and screening appointment for about 1 hour. Children will complete language arts and math assessments with a teacher, a speech/language assessment with a speech pathologist, and will participate in vision and hearing screenings with a medical aide. A school nurse will be present to talk to parents about medical records, children's allergies, and any medication or health plans that should be followed at school. Parents should bring all registration documents with them to be sure your child's school records are complete and ready for August.



Current KPP students and IPP peer models will be screened at school in May. Students on IEPs will not participate in kindergarten screening assessments unless it is recommended by the IEP team. Please refer to the letter sent by Mrs. Turner or call the Wilcox office if you have specific questions about the process for your child.
