Important Information about FAFSA

Annually, Twinsburg High School seniors complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) as an avenue to qualify for federal Pell grants which are worth up to nearly \$30,000 over four years, the Ohio College Opportunity Grant, and many other forms of state and federal financial aid. While about 50% of Ohio students who complete the FAFSA qualify for Pell grants, Ohio students who don't complete the application leave more than \$108 million in unclaimed financial aid "on the table" each year.

In past years, FAFSA opened on October 1st, however, the U.S. Department of Education is preparing an updated FAFSA which will launch in December. In preparation for this launch, seniors are asked to create a federal student aid account (FSA ID). This is required for the FAFSA. Doing so now will speed up the process for parents/guardians and students later.
