Positive Behavior Intervention Supports (PBIS) is an approach used by our schools to promote school safety and good behavior. With PBIS, staff members teach our students about behavior expectations and strategies. The focus of PBIS is prevention, not punishment. Ohio's PBIS Recognition System provides an opportunity to celebrate schools which implement stellar PBIS initiatives in support of students. Each year, the Ohio Department of Education and the PBIS Network recognize schools and Districts for their quality and fidelity of PBIS implementation. Schools are eligible to receive awards at the bronze, silver, and gold levels of distinction. I am delighted to share that all five (5) of our schools received awards of distinction:

- Wilcox Primary School Bronze Award
- Samuel Bissell Elementary School Silver Award
- George G. Dodge Intermediate School Silver Award
- RB Chamberlin Middle School Gold Award (3rd straight year)
- Twinsburg High School Bronze Award
