Saint Patrick's Day originated as a religious holiday. People commemorated, or honored, the memory of a Catholic missionary named Patrick. March 17<sup>th</sup>, the day of his death, is always St. Patrick's Day. Some legends claim that Saint Patrick chased all of the snakes out of Ireland and into the sea. Another Irish legend tells of leprechauns. Leprechauns are short, mischievous cobblers, or shoemakers, who are dressed in green and have an orange beard. They say that leprechauns hide pots of gold at the end of a rainbow. Leprechauns are said to live in Irish forests.

Over the years, St Patrick's Day has become a cultural as well as a religious holiday. People dress in emerald green whether they are Irish or not. Special foods such as corned beef and cabbage, Irish soda bread, and candy called Irish potatoes are eaten. One fast food restaurant even offers a minty, green milkshake during the month of March. Parties and parades with bagpipes are held in many cities throughout the world to celebrate this day.

## Articulation

- Red Flags
1. Student is hard to understand with a known context
  2. Student exhibits multiple sound errors that are not age appropriate
  3. Student has a slushy sound in speech on s, z, ch, sh, and/or j

## Language

- Red Flags
1. Student has difficulty following simple spoken directions.
  2. Student has limited vocabulary not due to second language, socio-economic, or environmental factors.
  3. Student use sentences that are not age appropriate.

## Other

- Red Flags
1. **Fluency:** Student frequently stutters when speaking (repeating, blocking, or prolonging sounds).
  2. **Pragmatics** (Social Skills): Student does not have age appropriate social skills (e.g., understanding emotions, jokes, and/or body language.)
  3. **Voice:** Student has an unusual quality to his/her voice (e.g., hoarse, nasal, breathy)
