FanSchool Requirements and Recommendations:

- 1. Student must have COPPA form on file giving consent
- 2. Students in grades 11 and 12 should use their school gmail to create their account
- 3. Students in grades k-10 can use their school gmail to create their account but students will not be able to reset their passwords or get trade notifications since they don't have access to external gmail. Teachers do have the capability to reset passwords and students would have to login to check for trade notifications.
- 4. If students in grades k-10 wish to create their accounts with a parent email, the attached permission slip must be sent home.

Do students need their own email addresses to log on? Yes, each student will need to register with a unique email address, which enables a student to sign in, see news trends, and make adjustments to their lineup. You can think about their email as a username too...

If you have email addresses that aren't hooked up to email, like Google Apps for Education (GAFE) accounts, you'll want to give your players the token on your Manage League page to enter on the "Join A League" page after they login. Don't forget that students without email capability can't reset their passwords or get trade notifications so you'll need to be prepared to reset passwords for them in the Players tab and encourage them to log in to monitor league activity.

Players will receive emails about trade offers and a notification when their teacher posts a message. Teachers will receive an email when a two players make a trade, enabling you to make adjustments if need be. Make sure emails from fanschool.org don't get blocked by your school's email filters (add eric@fanschool.org + team@fanschool.org to your email contacts + safe senders list). We use sendgrid.com for these auto-emails and only send emails that help users play better.

If your students don't have an email address or you're just inviting a few players to play as teams, you can make one up for each of them that follows a format such as firstname@lastname.org. Feel free to pick a system that works for your classes, but be consistent and help students remember their email-usernames if you choose this route. They won't actually be able to receive email at this address, but that's not a requirement to play. They simply need a unique email address to use to log in.
