WHEREAS, this Board finds that the amount of taxes which may be raised within the tenmill limitation by levies on the current tax duplicate will be insufficient to provide an adequate amount for the necessary requirements of the School District and that it is necessary to levy a tax in excess of that limitation for the purpose of current expenses; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Section 5705.03(B) of the Revised Code, in order to submit the question of a tax levy pursuant to Section 5705.21 of the Revised Code, this Board must request that the Summit County Fiscal Officer certify (i) the total current tax valuation of the School District and (ii) the dollar amount of revenue that would be generated by the levy; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Section 5705.03(B), upon receipt of a certified copy of a resolution of this Board declaring the necessity of the tax, stating its purpose, whether it is an additional levy or a renewal or a replacement of an existing tax, and the Section of the Revised Code authorizing its submission to the electors, and requesting such certification, the County Fiscal Officer is to certify the total current tax valuation of the School District and the dollar amount of revenue that would be generated by the proposed levy;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Education of Twinsburg City School District, County of Summit, Ohio, that:

Section 1. <u>Declaration of Necessity of Tax Levy</u>. This Board declares that it is necessary to levy, for a continuing period of time, an additional 4.9-mill ad valorem property tax outside of the ten-mill limitation for the purpose of current expenses, and that it intends to submit the question of the additional tax levy to the electors at an election on November 6, 2012, as authorized by Section 5705.21 of the Revised Code. If approved, the additional tax would first be levied in tax year 2012, for first collection in calendar year 2013.

Section 2. <u>Request for Certification</u>. This Board requests the Summit County Fiscal Officer to certify to it both (i) the total current tax valuation of the School District and (ii) the dollar amount of revenue that would be generated by the additional levy specified in Section 1.

Section 3. <u>Certification and Delivery of Resolution to County Fiscal Officer</u>. The Treasurer of this Board is authorized and directed to deliver or cause to be delivered promptly to the Summit County Fiscal Officer a certified copy of this Resolution.

Section 4. <u>Compliance with Open Meeting Requirements</u>. This Board finds and determines that all formal actions of this Board and of any of its committees concerning and

relating to the adoption of this Resolution were taken, and that all deliberations of this Board and of any of its committees that resulted in those formal actions were held, in meetings open to the public in compliance with the law.

Section 5. <u>Captions and Headings</u>. The captions and headings in this Resolution are solely for convenience of reference and in no way define, limit or describe the scope or intent of any Sections, subsections, paragraphs, subparagraphs or clauses hereof.

Section 6. <u>Effective Date</u>. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and immediately upon its adoption.
