



Twinsburg City School District Strategic Planning Journey



This will be evidenced by High Quality Professional Development and the ongoing implementation of Blended Learning strategies in both on campus and virtual classrooms.



High Quality Professional Development

- → Weeks of August 17 and 24, 2020
- → Data Day, September 28, 2020
- → Professional Development, November 3, 2020
- → Co-taught lessons

During the five building Strategic Planning update meetings, each grade band provided a metric to determine growth for the 2nd semester. Examples:

Grades 9-12:

- 1. Identify teachers who received professional development in one or more Blended Learning strategies during Quarter 3 to increase knowledge and comfort with the strategy.
- 2. Gather report card data from Quarter 3 of identified teachers and compare Quarter 3 data to comparable classes of same teachers at the end of Quarter 4.



Examples:

Grades 7 & 8:

The overall grade point average across all subgroups will improve 2/10 of a point by the end of the third nine weeks.

Grades 2-6:

Reading - Teachers assess students to determine their guided reading levels through the Fall Running Record Administration. Teachers provide Reading instruction at specified levels to address reading skills and reading comprehension. Teachers use this information to deliver appropriate instruction, as based on the data collected.



One action step of the 21st Century Teaching and Learning is to include more diverse literature into our classrooms. We are actively looking to make adjustments to:

- → Read Alouds
- → Guided Reading
- → Summer Reading
- → Course Reading
- → Library Collections

Our desire is that all students are reflected within the literature they are reading.

- To date Mrs. Larsen has made contact with over 50 preK, K, and 1st grade students, has worked directly with 35 students
- Serves as a liaison between school and home

 - During January 2021 remote learning will record videos and lead live lessons


Morning Meetings

- Greeting: Students and teachers greet and welcome each other.
 - i. Adapted to each classroom
- Sharing or Activity: Students share something about themselves or their lives and the rest
 of their peers listen, then ask follow-up questions or offer comments; or they participate in
 an activity encourages teamwork while re-emphasizing social or academic skills.
 - Ensure Structure
- Morning message: Students read a short message from their teacher, usually describing what is to come in the day ahead.

Culture and Climate - Morning Meetings & Tiger Days


Morning Meetings/Tiger Days: The Dodge School Counselors have created a daily template for Morning Meetings. This template is used to align student supports and provide teachers with the tools needed to enhance the daily lesson planning for Morning Meetings. Tiger Days are a component of Morning Meeting. Under the guidance of our school counselors, administrative team, and staff, Tiger days are held monthly. During Tiger Days, students are encouraged to be involved, through discussion and action, in the creation of

their own positive school environment.



Culture and Climate - Morning Meetings & Tiger Days Student results of 5 point ranking





Culture and Climate - Student Results What Day's Theme Do You Enjoy the Most?






Culture and Climate - Staff Results Are Morning Meetings Valuable to Teachers





TCSD will partner with a marketing consultant to define a plan which engages stakeholders to gather additional feedback and determine the direction of the Conceptual Legacy Project.



Facilities

- Three HVAC/Lighting Assessments in Process by Energy Conservation Companies
 - Review and update the 2019 Facilities Assessment by looking at lighting systems, HVAC systems and COVID-19 considerations
 - Goal is to develop an energy conservation project that addresses a number of the items identified in the 2019 Facilities Assessment that would be funded through future guaranteed energy savings
- Other Major Infrastructure Reviews and Updates in Process
 - Examples include roofing, paving and plumbing reviews


Finance

- Utilize Federal Grants to mitigate the COVID-19 Pandemic driven cost burden



RBC PAC Feedback (16 Students):

- Limit 2 people at a time in Restrooms (Currently 4)
- Soap Checks/Fills
- Reminders to wash hands/use hand sanitizer before lunch
- Better separation of students during pickup

Safety: Bissell's Change Agents

- 24 students representing each on-campus classroom
- Meet once a month to discuss safety topics and concerns
- Feedback used to implement change and make improvements as a school
