Spanish Partnership: THS and Bissell Elementary 2024-2025

Background about the Partnership

Last year my daughter, Mia Potkalitsky, one of Mr. Santiago's 2nd year Spanish Learners, came to my third grade classroom to present a children's book she wrote in Spanish. She also brought two related activities to do with my students. Those activities included making a book with common everyday Spanish words used in a child's home or school. My students were fully engaged and offered feedback throughout the lesson. I later found out just how impactful this Spanish lesson was with my students when other students from other 3rd grade classes came up to me and were speaking Spanish. Come to find out, my students were teaching other students how to speak Spanish at recess. My class was later exposed to Spanish traditions and holidays because of their interest in learning. Mia Potkalitsky, who taught this lesson, did a wonderful job teaching. She was very proud of her book and the young students who loved it.

How the Program Works

It was our proposal, Mr. Santiago, Mrs. Grady, and myself, that we build a partnership with the Spanish department and Samuel Bissell Elementary. We have connected with Mr. Santiago's first block of Spanish 2 students from THS who use the opportunity to showcase their work in our 2nd and 3rd grade classrooms. We feel this is a great opportunity for our older Tigers and younger Tigers to work together all while celebrating and learning about language and culture. Our Tigers are collaborating once a quarter. We would love to see how the program evolves over the years.

This proposal provides an opportunity for our High School students to showcase their work, reinforcing their learning and also their presentational skills. Our younger Tigers will get the benefit of learning another language and culture preparing them for future learning at RBC.








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Fit Club



What is MTSS?




MTSS is a proactive framework for students, that provides multiple tiers of instruction and support, by using integrated data collection and assessment system to inform decisions. MTSS involves academic, behavior, attendance, and social-emotional well-being.

Multiple tiers of instruction and layers of support

Tier I/Differentiated Core

All students receive high quality, differentiated core academic and behavioral classroom instruction.



Tier II A and B/Supplemental Support

Small group targeted instruction is layered in addition to core instruction. Parents are contacted that additional supports are needed and the student's progress is monitored.

Tier III/Intensive Intervention

When the student is not making adequate progress with the Tier II supports, the support is intensified. Parents are contacted again and student's progress is monitored more frequently.

TCSD Goals for MTSS...

The (2) goals for the TCSD's MTSS process during 2024-2025 are:

- Develop and use common terms/vocabulary across the District
- Implement a consistent MTSS process and guidebook to be used across all buildings (including Tiers of Support, referrals for academic/behavioral concerns; and data collection - beginning with administrators)



MTSS Progress UPDATE . . .

- 2024-2025 School Year
 - MTSS School visits and process reviews
 - MTSS Needs assessment survey given to all certified staff October 2024
 - 140 Responses
 - 35.1% of respondents believe the MTSS is effectively implemented
 - Challenges noted in the survey:
 - Universal expectations, terms, and processes related to MTSS
 - Collaboration time
 - Knowledge of successful evidence-based interventions



During the 2024-2025 school year, the Twinsburg City School District will complete the preparation phase of the Tiger Legacy Project by initializing design plans, conducting engineering assessments, and determining pilot bus routes to effectively merge three (3) elementary schools into a Preschool - Grade 6 elementary school building.
