


## 21st Century Teaching and Learning

Multi-sensory learning experiences to support literacy development in young children

- Rhyme
  - predict vocabulary
- **Musical patterns** and a consistent, steady beat (clapping, gross motor, playing instruments):
  - mimic the flow of speech
  - hear and segment sounds
  - build phonemic awareness
- Sign language "One Small Voice" Jack Hartmann
  - reinforces word recognition and meaning,
  - supports visual and kinesthetic learners
  - develops stronger connection to new words by acting them out

Develop memory skills, which are essential for reading comprehension and fluency




DURING THE 2024-2025 SCHOOL YEAR, I WILL SUPPORT THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE SCIENCE

Initialization of the Electronic Inventory System (EIS) for the District Capital Asset Inventory:

- All District Capital Assets as of June 30, 2024 are now loaded into the new EIS system
- We are working on adding/removing current fiscal year items (in past practices this was usually done in July/August after the FY was closed)
- Our ultimate goal is to have the accounting and inventory software electronically communicate with each other - so not as much manual data needs to be entered

- \$97 million compared to the \$107 million in Nov. 2024
- 3.84 mills compared to the previous 4.27 mills
- Maximum Term: 36 years




"When one seeks a home loan from the bank, years of assets and expenses are required for approval. Isn't the community the bank?"

In this example the district/(community) is the homeowner and various investors across the country who purchase the bonds are the "bank". The district does undergo a vigorous credit review from an outside third party credit rating agency, before the bonds are offered for sale to investors so that they know the district is a "good" investment.
