10. Know your P's and Q's

- Identify upper and lowercase letters
- Print letters with neat handwriting
- Identify letter sounds Fundations
- Print name with upper and lowercase
- Identify color and number words



9. Count Everything

- Count forwards and backwards
- Count in small groups to 50, then 100
- Count by 10's, 5's and 2's
- Recognize and start counting money
- Tell time to the hour and half hour
- Be familiar with a 100's grid to 120
- GO MATH series 10 Frame



8. READ,READ,READ...Oh. And discuss too!

- Studies show reading scores improve with parents that read to a child regularly
- Read 15 20 mins nightly (HW)
- Don't forget to ask about the story relate it to the child
- Take a look at the 150 first grade sight words



7. It's Habit-Forming! Ah Yes! ROUTINE!

- Very important to establish a routine
- Set aside a time and place for homework
- There will be homework in first grade, most have it every evening
- Help with organization at home (place to put papers, keep newsletter, calendar, etc)



6. Be Prepared

- Supplies no shared supplies, make sure they have their supplies daily
- Take Home Folder, Reading Bag/Folders
- Homework make sure it is done and turned in on time
- Responsibility now lies with the student



5.What's that you say? Communicate!

- Keep an open mind, they take everything literally
- Send notes, email, phone message
- Let us know if something has changed at home
 – divorce, death, new pets, etc.
- Don't be surprised if they don't want to go to school about the fourth week of school – Patience, they will adjust
- Set up time to talk to the teacher



4. Expect UPS and DOWNS – Emotional Rollercoaster

- Average is okay! Not all gifted and talented
- Don't compare them with your neighbor
- Every child learns differently and at varying rates
- There is no nap time and lunch seems like a long way off. They are tired!
- Most classes do have a snack time each morning
- Let them make mistakes and make it a lesson



3. A Little Help Goes a LONG Way

- Do their homework with them check for errors
- Go over completed papers and check for mistakes
- Use your child's newsletter to help you
- Extra help at home can really be the difference maker for many children
