### **CURRICULUM INITIATIVES FOR 2022–2023**

### **Updates**

- · District-Wide Courses of Study were approved and uploaded to the District website. These ever-changing documents illustrate what is being taught in the classroom for each subject.
- mCLASS is the tool we will use as the Dyslexia Screener, as well as the qualifier for students to be placed on a Reading Improvement and Monitoring Plan (RIMP).
- Twinsburg City School District Career Framework was created as part of the Strategic Plan. Each building is represented with strategies and activities.
- The Global Seal of Biliteracy was available again in 2022-2023; 45 students received this award. 31 students received the Ohio Seal of Biliteracy. These awards are given to students who demonstrate a high level of proficiency in English and one other language as evidenced by passage of the STAMP test.
- · A total of 121 Honors Diplomas were issued; comprised of 85 Academic with Honors, 2 Career Tech Honors, 30 STEM Honors, 3 Arts Honors, and 1 Social Science & Civic Engagement Diplomas.
- · New Early Learning and Development Standards were approved.
- · IXL, an online adaptive practice tool was in use for second graders through eighth graders. Students answered over 8.8 million questions!
- The class of 2023 earned 1,532 Ohio State Seals.
- · Primary reading instruction is moving from a Balanced Literacy approach to a Structured Literacy Model.

### **New Courses of Study**

- Motion Graphics 2 Course provides students in-depth instruction in Adobe After Effects. Students are taking this new course in Fall 2023.
- This course focuses on place-based education empowering students to take an active role in their community. Course is offered to all eleventh graders in 2023-2024.
- AP Macroeconomics expands the college-level offerings in Economics.

  This ideal course for students interested in a business curriculum is offered in Fall 2023.

### Several new textbooks were approved for adoption

- The new Motion Graphic 2 class will utilize Adobe Animate Classroom in a Book.
- · Biology for the AP will be the updated textbook for the AP Biology course at THS.


- · Wilcox and Bissell are \$3.25

In 2023-24, Twinsburg Food Service will continue to provide the freshest and healthiest foods to our students, while moving towards offering a wider variety of new dishes along with old favorites.



Along with normal price meals in 2023-2024, the Twinsburg City School District will still have federally funded meals for those who qualify financially. Families may apply by utilizing our new online meal and fee waiver application, MySchoolApps. This online application will be accessible on our web page, as well as on Final Forms and our online registration beginning in July 2023. MySchoolApps online application will eliminate the need for paper applications, eliminating the problem with lost applications in the mail or lost on the way to school.

### Student Wellness

The Department of Student Wellness continued the momentum generated last year by expanding initiatives in the areas of training, education and accessibility of community and school services.

Since being formed in 2019, it has been the mission of the Department of Student Wellness to develop, guide, and advance efforts of wellness.

In its fourth year, the Student Wellness team (which is comprised of school counselors, school social workers, school nursing and health staff, etc.) aimed to expand staff training, student learning and start conversations related to the health and positive emotional persistence of our students and staff. They were also able to advance many meaningful initiatives aimed to improve school culture via PBIS (Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports) and other efforts. The efforts were targeted, specific and held significant potential for positive impact.

This upcoming year looks to place more emphasis on the Social Emotional Learning curriculum as well as staff professional development designed to leverage resources, communication, understanding and collaboration on a menu of opportunities.

Special Education: Special Education Services include the development of programming to meet the individualized needs of a student. Eligibility for Special Education services is determined through an Evaluation Team Report completed by school personnel with parental input. When a student is eligible for Special Education service under one of the 13 disability categories, an Individualized Education Program (IEP) is developed to determine the specialized instruction, accommodations, and modifications that will support the student.

**Section 504 Plans:** The purpose of a Section 504 Plan is to provide students with disabilities equal access to education through the use of accommodations. Students eligible for 504 Plans must be identified as having a disability (physical or mental) that substantially limits one or more major life activities.

 Early Childhood: The Twinsburg City School District's Preschool program is located at Wilcox Primary School and serves children with disabilities and also provides an opportunity for typically developing children to serve as social and academic role models (peers) in the classroom. Our program aligns to the Early Learning and Development Standards.

 Child Find: Child Find is the process of locating, evaluating, and identifying children with disabilities who may be in need of special education and related services. The Twinsburg City School District provides early childhood programs for children with identified disabilities and comprehensive programs and related services for children with disabilities ages 3 through 21.

Parent Mentor: The Parent Mentor Project is a program funded through the Ohio Department of Education. This program is designed to support families in understanding the Special Education process by providing information to become active partners for their students with special needs. The overall goal of the Parent Mentor Project is to help the Special Education process feel less intimidating to families.

- Title I (\$334,343) provided funding for reading and math instruction for students needing additional support in grades one through eight.
- Title IIA (\$67,224) funds provided staff development in various subject areas and substitutes.
- Title III (\$16,102) monies helped fund the teacher for students who are English Learners (EL).
- Title IV (\$26,513) monies for technology, innovative programming, and substitutes.
- · IDEA-B (\$804,104) funding was earmarked for Special Education services, such as instructional assistants, professional development, collaboration among regular education teachers and intervention specialists.
- The Parent-Mentor Grant (\$25,000) provided funding for a parent who works as a liaison for the District and with families who have students with special needs.

At Wilcox Primary School, the staff members are committed to creating a supportive, inclusive environment where all students belong. Wilcox Primary School staff is grateful for the support of our Board of Education, PTA, and the community partnerships that help us fulfill our goal of helping children grow and succeed.

For our school community's youngest learners, "the journey begins here" at Wilcox Primary School. Wilcox remains committed to helping all students grow to:

- Develop good citizenship and an appreciation of our diverse community
- · Build a strong foundation in literacy and number sense
- · Learn to think critically through projects and problem-solving
- · Become able to regulate their own emotions

At the beginning of the 2022-2023 school year, teachers set professional goals that aligned with the District's Strategic Plan. These goals became their personal "roadmaps" throughout the year as they planned instruction, collaborated with colleagues, and worked with parents and community partners. Some important highlights of the 2022-2023 school year include:

- Wilcox Primary School continues to be recognized by the Ohio Department of Education as a 5-Star Step Up to Quality preschool program and as a Purple Star School for a strong commitment to students and families connected to our nation's military.
- Wilcox Primary School teachers, administrators, and instructional assistants completed 18 hours of dyslexia training through the Ohio Department of Education.
- Implementation of the Science of Reading was pervasive at Wilcox Primary School during the 2022-2023 school year. Teachers utilized Heggerty phonemic awareness lessons and Fundations phonics instruction to help students learn the foundational components of language development as they started their journey as readers and writers.
- Hands-on learning, problem-solving, and critical thinking are important components of STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Math) learning opportunities for Wilcox students. These experiences are embedded in classroom projects such as the creation of a space station, researching the climate and animals in the Arctic, and predicting and testing items to see what will sink or float.
- The entire student body at Wilcox Primary School participated in a "Spread the Love" activity where student groups created candy bags and thank you cards that were donated to community first responders such as the fire department, the police department, and workers at University Hospital and the Cleveland Clinic.
- · As part of the primary grade music curriculum, students created musical instruments from recycled materials. After learning about instruments from different cultures, this unit integrated the science of music production, such as sound and vibration, with the importance of taking care of our earth.
- Through the Tigerthon/Color Run fundraiser, the Wilcox Parent-Teacher Association (PTA) brought character and fitness lessons to Wilcox Primary School, raising over \$20,000 to help support PTA programs that directly benefit students and staff.



For the 2023-2024 school year, Wilcox Primary School will continue to offer students a welcoming environment of acceptance and a challenging curriculum with high expectations for all students.

Twinsburg High School, among the top schools in Ohio and the nation, offers diverse academic, arts, and extracurricular programs. Emphasizing employment, enrollment, and enlistment upon graduation, our 351 graduating seniors were recognized for their hard work on May 23rd. This group, one of our largest, met all graduation requirements and left an impression on our community. They received almost \$43 million in scholarship offers and over \$60,000 in local scholarships.

Twinsburg High School implemented strategies aligned with Ohio's PBIS framework, cultivating a positive learning environment. Students established the "Tiger Three" characteristics: respect, right choices, and responsibility. Administrators worked with District principals to align practices for positive student outcomes. Comprising parents, students, and staff, the PBIS team submitted an application for Ohio's Bronze designation.

Twinsburg High School emphasized workforce development and employment. Counselors surveyed students and coordinated with District leadership to hold the 2nd annual Job Fair on March 14th, attracting over 50 employers, organizations, and recruiters, with about 700 students participating. Many employers praised the politeness, preparedness, and engagement of our students. With the Twinsburg City School District Business Advisory Council's guidance, the Job Fair expanded from the previous year. Over 160 seniors joined the THS Senior Experience Symposium in the spring, shadowing at local businesses and presenting their learnings in fields like education, engineering, computer science, sales, etc., on May 16, 2023.

The Visual Arts Department continued to excel under the leadership of Mr. Dan Lunde. Each year the Alliance for Young Artists and Writers announces its Scholastic Art and Writing Awards. Kelsey McDonough received Honorable Mention, and Rishika Patil earned a Silver Key. Twinsburg High School artists also participated in the PTA Reflections Art Competition this year. Vani Modi received the 1st Honorable Mention, Craig Thompson received the 2nd Honorable Mention, Ella Grummitt received the 3rd Honorable Mention, and Colin Bryant received the Award of Excellence. In addition, Twinsburg High School students also participated in The Ohio Governor's Youth Art Exhibition. Claire Schaus and Ani'a Thomas advanced to round two of the Ohio Governor's Youth Art Exhibition, and Rishika Patil advanced to states level exhibition.

The Performing Arts Department, under the leadership of Mr. Peter Hampton (Vocal), Mr. Damon Conn (Orchestra), and Mr. Ryan Bonitz (Band), continue to excel. Twinsburg High School's vocal music department grew and thrived this year, with assistance from new Dodge vocal music teacher Matthew Szekely. Blue Harmony (formerly Mood Swingers) competed in two show choir competitions for the first time since early 2020. Also, Twinsburg High School hosted the Northcoast Show Choir Invitational, with nine participating choirs. In January, five students participated in the Suburban League Honor Choir at Hudson High School, where they worked with acclaimed choral director Dr. Hilary Apfelstadt. Great Expectations (GE) performed at five competitions in Ohio and Indiana and blew audiences away with their Fire and Ice show. In March, GE took a trip to Chicago, where they performed at the Field Museum, explored many exciting cultural attractions, and participated in a show choir workshop. The future of the THS vocal music program continues to look bright, with a projected increase in participation for the 2023-2024 school year of more than 20 students.

Summer is one of the busiest times for the Technology Department and the summer of 2022 was no exception:

- Replaced PC's in the Twinsburg High School Interactive Media Lab

### Technology projects that were completed during the 2022-2023 school year:

- Continue to complete updates to the operating system of District laptops and inactive flat panels
- Upgrade select Twinsburg High School instructional labs as a part of the replacement cycle

### **Grants:**

- The Twinsburg City School District received an Ohio School Safety Grant for \$208,481 that provided funds for additional indoor and outdoor security cameras, door access fob scanners, and handheld radios.
- The Twinsburg City School District received an Ohio EPA Water Bottle Refilling Station Grant for \$8,093.55 towards the purchase and installation of additional bottle filler stations at each building.
- The Twinsburg City School District saved approximately \$268,000 from 2022 to the present by participating in the Power4Schools Program.
- The Twinsburg City School District has received over \$16,000 in rebates from First Energy/Ohio Edison to reduce electricity consumption.
- By participating in an Energy Demand Response Program/CPower through the Ohio Schools Council, the District received \$52,807.32 in rebate checks since the inception of the program.

### Major Permanent Improvements for 2022-2023 School Year:

- Energy Conservation Project—upgrades to our HVAC infrastructure, LED lighting retrofits, and improvements to numerous other energy systems have allowed for over \$115,000 in energy savings to date.
- Major asphalt paving and resurfacing at Twinsburg High School, RB Chamberlin Middle School, Wilcox Primary School, Tiger Trail, Paw Point, and other District roadways and parking areas (approximately \$500,000).
- Purchased 2,010 new Chromebooks as part of our Chromebook Replacement Cycle (approximately \$562,800)
- Purchased three (3) buses as part of our ten-year bus replacement cycle (approximately \$324,500).
- HVAC & Public Address System wiring and automation repairs at George G.
   Dodge Intermediate School.
- The District's playgrounds, bleachers, stages and kilns are inspected regularly to ensure the safety of the students and staff.
- · Various roofing repairs were made at all five (5) buildings.
- Various smaller summer projects are based on the Facilities Strategic Plan of 2022 and 2023.

### Update on Facilities Strategic Plan

Over the past several years, the District has gathered additional input on the long-term facilities needs and vision of the community by continuing to develop the Tiger Legacy Project with the District's key stakeholders. This includes various Focus Group discussions with key stakeholders, various Facilities Strategic Action Team meetings, and community surveys. In addition, the District created a website, twinsburg.k12.oh.us/TigerLegacyProject.aspx, that includes several videos talking about the need for a project and a presentation about the Facilities Assessment and potential Tiger Legacy Project. The District continues to seek feedback to develop the Tiger Legacy Project based on the needs and desires of the community.

In addition, the Twinsburg City School District continues to update and utilize the comprehensive immediate-high priority, mid-range, and long-range components of the Facilities Strategic Plan. The Facilities Strategic Plan is based upon the 2023 update of the 2016/2019 Facilities Assessment by Lesko Associates and Karpinski Engineering. Most recently, the Board of Education approved a partnership with the Ohio Facilities Construction Commission (OFCC) to join the Expedited Local Partnership Program (ELPP) in order to obtain updated facilities assessments and enrollment projections at no cost commitment to the District. This data and community engagement will then be applied to restructuring the Facilities Master Plan.

This Plan has been significantly influenced and reinforced by the Facilities Strategic Planning Committee and various Focus Groups since the 2017-2018 school year. As a result, the Facilities Strategic Plan serves as a guide to ensure that the District efficiently and effectively spends its Permanent Improvement dollars toward its long-term initiatives. Utilizing results from the Facilities Assessment to help guide Permanent Improvement expenditures, all major projects this year were identified as higher priorities in our Facilities Assessment.






### **Finances**




Ohio's K-12 education is funded through a "shared" method using both state and local resources. In TCSD, the responsibility to fund our schools rests largely with our local taxpayers.

### What are our spending priorities?


Most of our general operating budget is earmarked for salaries and benefits of our teachers and support staff who directly impact the experience our students have every day.

The revenue and expenditure trends are impacting the District's bottom line. Several factors impact the District's revenue, such as the phase-out of the Tangible Personal Property tax, the Fair School Funding Plan not being fully implemented, and House Bill 920 ensuring that levy-generated income doesn't increase with property value increases. This is amid an economic environment marked by a 6% inflation rate.
